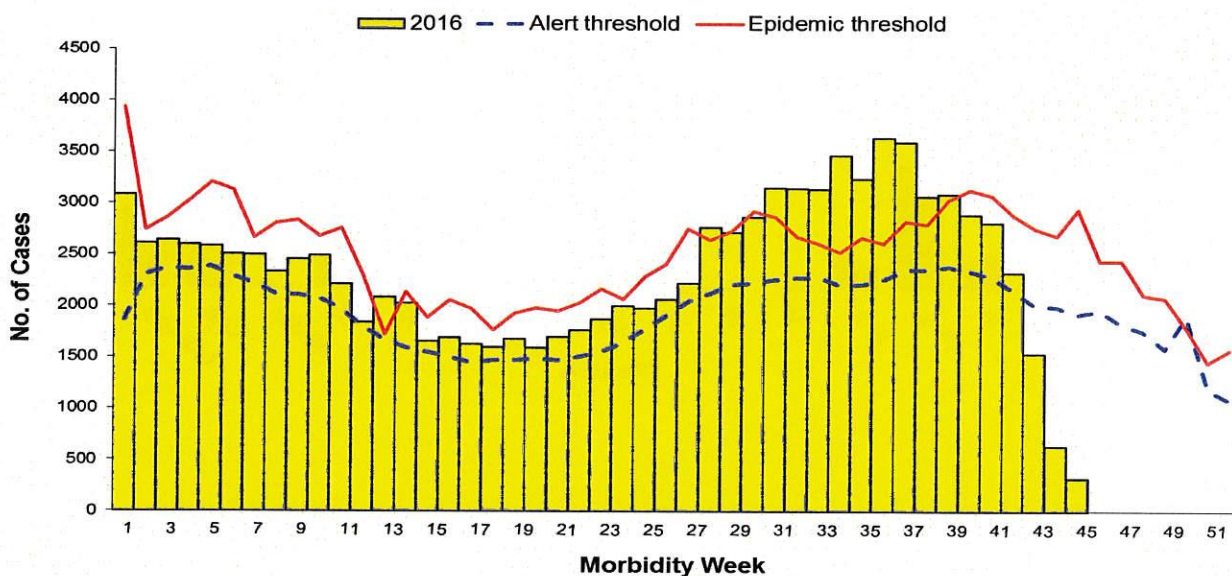




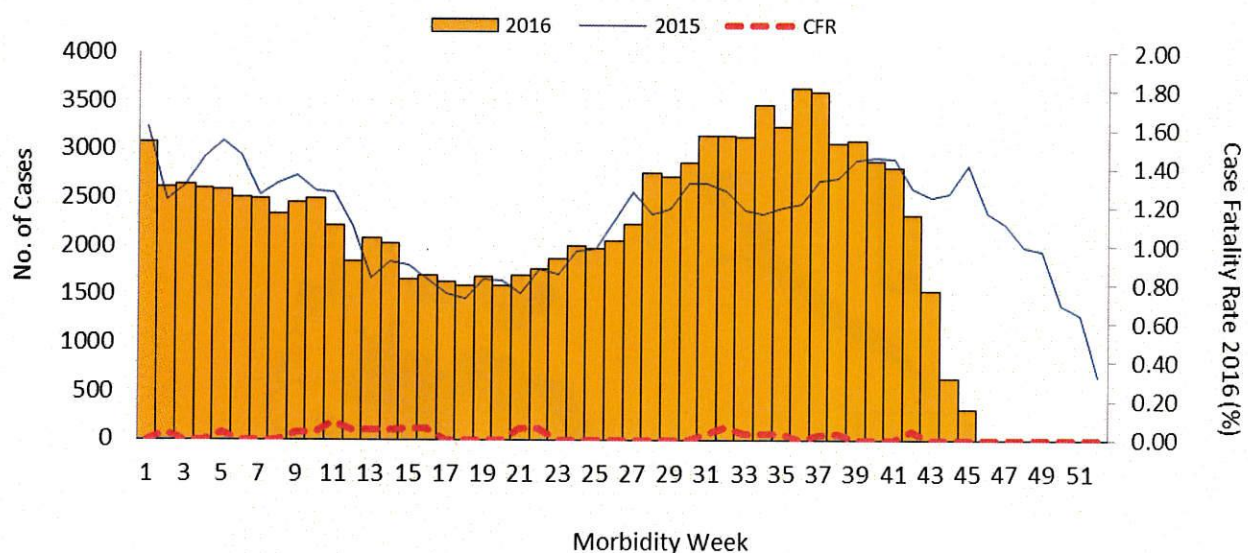
## Trend in the Philippines

This report summarizes PIDSR ILI surveillance activities nationwide. A total of **105,634** Influenza-like Illness cases were reported nationwide from January 1 to November 12, 2016. This is **0.5%** lower compared to the same time period last year (**106,140**).

2016\* vs 2015 (N=105,634)**





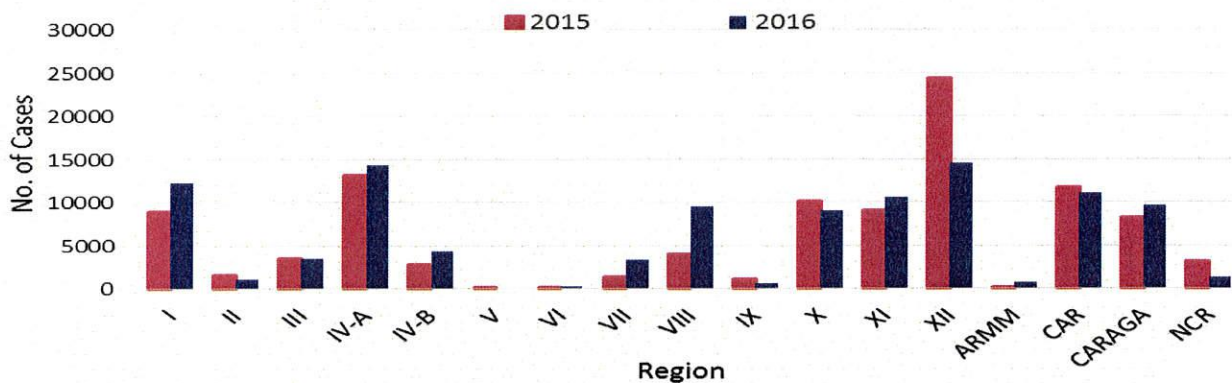
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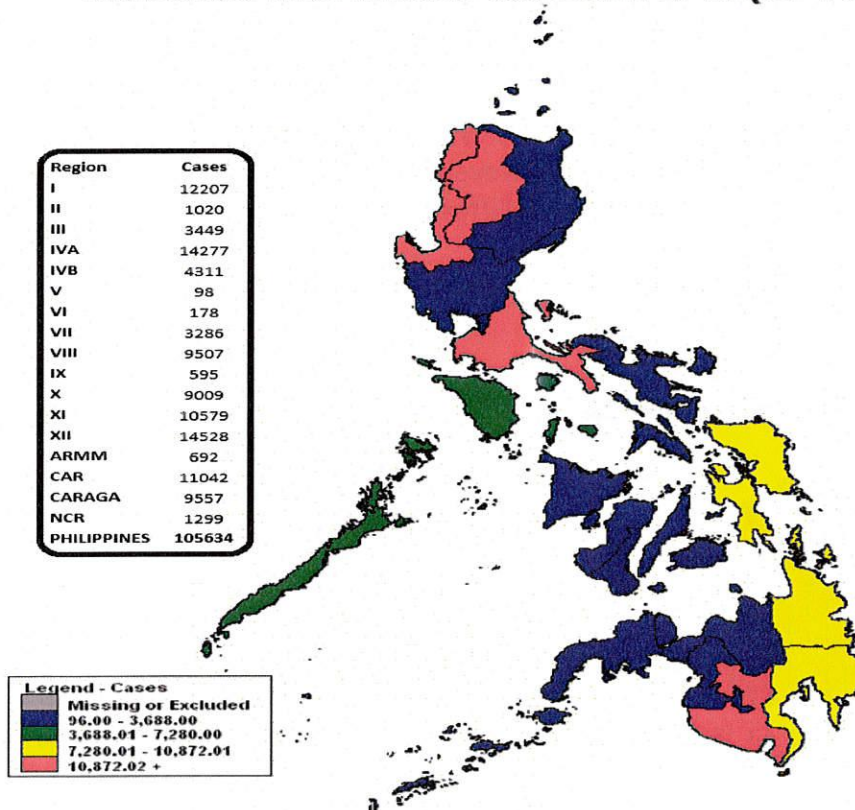
## Geographic Distribution

Most of the cases were from the following regions: **Region XII** (13.8%), **Region IVA** (13.5%), **Region I** (11.6%), **CAR** (10.4%) and **Region XI** (10.1%) (Fig. 3).

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### Profile of Cases

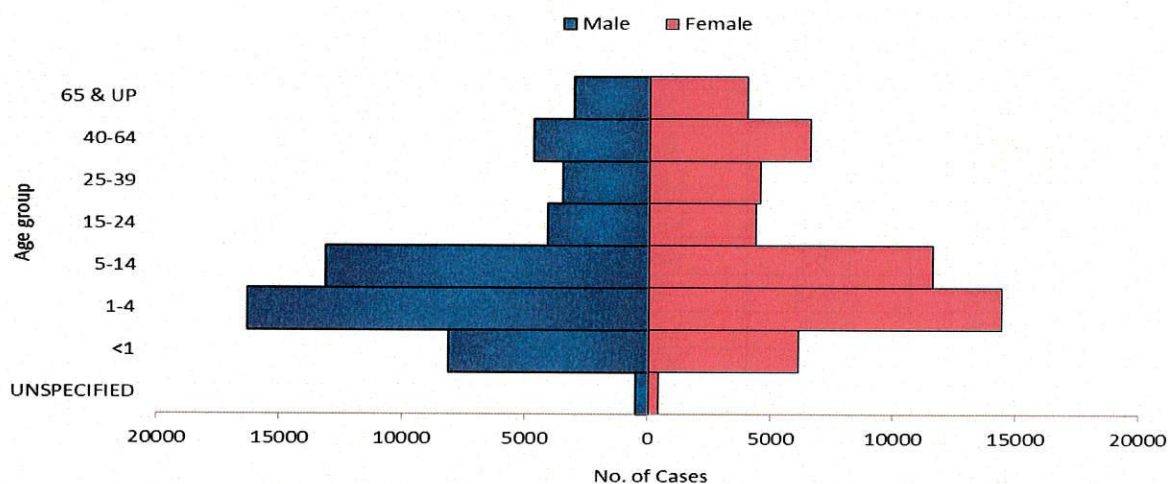
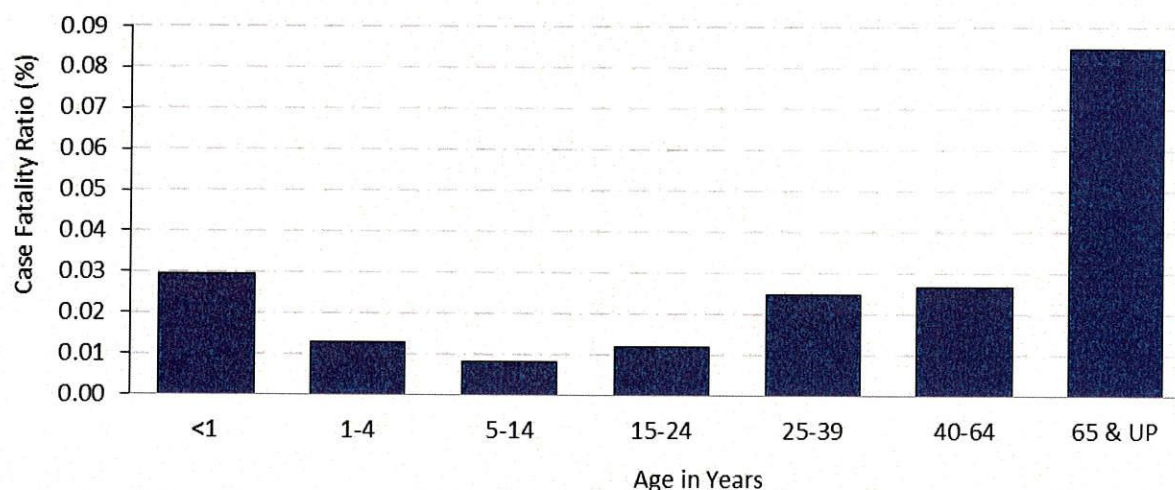


Fig. 5 Influenza-like Illness Case Fatality Rate (CFR) by Age Group,

Ages of cases ranged from less than 1 month to 100 years old (median= 6 years). Majority of cases were male (50.6%). Most of the cases belonged to the 1 to 4 years age group (29.5%) (Fig. 4). There were 22 reported deaths (CFR=0.02%) (Fig. 5).

Philippines, as of November 12, 2016 (N=105,634)
