SUBJECT: Guidelines Relative to Ramping up of COVID-19 Contact Tracing and Testing

Since July 11, 2022, the Philippines has been experiencing a cumulative positivity rate for COVID-19 of more than the threshold of ten percent (10%). As of September 05, 2022, the cumulative positivity rate for COVID-19 in the Philippines is at 13.79%, with the majority of regions having positivity rates above the ten percent (10%) threshold.

This memorandum highlights the guidelines for concerned authorities who will conduct ramp-up COVID-19 contact tracing and testing. Pursuant to DM No 2022-0013 dated January 14, 2022, titled "Updated Guidelines on Quarantine, Isolation, and Testing for COVID-19 Response and Case Management for the Omicron Variant", COVID-19 RT-PCR testing shall be prioritized for the following population groups:

A1*: Health care workers

A2: Senior Citizens

A3**: Persons with Co-morbidities, including those at high risk for severe disease

Further, should there be more resources available, all concerned authorities and COVID-19 laboratories may conduct RT-PCR testing for close contacts, provided that the following criteria must be met:

Symptomatic close contacts: testing at the onset of symptoms.

Asymptomatic close contacts: testing should be done at least five (5) days from the day of last exposure.
