

## Highlights and Recent Updates on COVID-19

- The Philippine Business for Social Progress donated 3,000 Cepheid GeneXpert cartridges for COVID-19. These cartridges were received on April 29.
- DOH acknowledged the mental health burden brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic to the public. As such, the Department continues to urge the public protect their mental health by constantly communicating to their families and peers, and to seek mental health consultation when needed via these hotlines.
- DOH reminded health facilities across the country that donated personal protective equipment (PPEs) cannot be charged to the patient.
- The Department of Education (DepEd) is set to implement physical distancing measures for the upcoming school opening and recommends smaller class size.
   Alternative learning modules shall also be offered for students staying at home.
- DepEd reiterated its promise of ensuring the safety and welfare of teachers, school staff, and students alike through the observance of the following measures: 1) regularly disinfecting schools; 2) providing teacher training to ensure they are well-equipped to deal with the New Normal setting in the classroom; and 3) setting up quarantine areas in schools in case anyone experiences symptoms.
- The learning needs of children with disabilities (CWD) amidst the New Normal is equally highlighted. In ensuring that CWD's special needs are addressed, the creation of an Individualized Education Program (IEP) is highly recommended.



## A. Healthcare Workers affected by COVID-19








## C. Epidemiologic Curve

- A total of 5,640 (69%) are confirmed cases from NCR.
- Top 3 barangays: **Tandang Sora, Quezon City (54); San Antonio, Parañaque (49)** and **Batasan Hills, Quezon City (46).**
- Still too early to tell whether Enhanced Community
  Quarantine (ECQ) is effective as reporting delays from
  symptom onset take around 11 days, but initial
  imputation analysis seems to suggest that ECQ is
  keeping new case numbers steady.
- Recent surge of cases from Cebu City, also now has two of the largest non-Metro Manila clusters: Sitio Zapatera and Cebu City Jail.
- Also still too early to tell whether Luzon-wide ECQ is effective, but initial imputation analysis seems to suggest that ECQ is keeping new case numbers steady.







## Goal: Increase Resilience, Stop Transmission, Reduce Contact

### **BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES OF THE DAY**

- The DOH reinforced in its virtual presser what the New Normal means and what it entails. According to the Department, the New Normal is both a practice and a mindset that places prime importance on healthy lifestyles and preventive behaviors to avoid getting sick.
- The DOH expressed its hopes that the COVID-19 health emergency would give the public a heightened sense of health consciousness, and that the lessons gained from the pandemic would always be remembered as the New Normal era emerges.
- The DOH also highlighted in its social media channels ways for the elderly to take care of themselves to avoid getting infected with COVID-19. These measures include:
  - Avoiding unnecessary travels outside the home;
  - Eating fruits, vegetables, fish, and other healthy food:
  - Drinking 8-10 glasses of water daily;
  - Exercising inside the home;
  - Getting a healthy amount of sunlight for at least 10 minutes every day; and
  - Sleeping for 6-8 hours every night.





## HOW DO YOU REMAIN SAFE AND HEALTHY AMIDST THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC?

ALWAYS remember and practice the following:



Wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds or more (Try singing the chorus of your favorite song while washing).



Use a hand sanitizer with 70% alcohol if you can't wash your hands for 20 seconds or more.



Avoid touching your face, especially your mouth, eyes, nose.



Make sure you keep 1 meter distance from other people.



Avoid touching things that many people touch like door handles, tables, chairs, etc.



Wear a mask while outside.



Frequently clean surfaces in your house, work or business. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keys, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.



Disinfect using a bleach solution (7 tablespoons [100 mL] bleach for 1 liter of clean water).




Disinfect your most used things (like phone, keys, eyeglasses, keyboard, etc.) with 70% alcohol solution.

## PHILHEALTH FOR ALL

PhilHealth in an Advisory<sup>1</sup> reminded all accredited HIV treatment hubs and primary HIV care facilities to ensure that people living with HIV (PLHIVs) enrolled in their facilities are able to access needed health services especially anti-retroviral drugs (ARVs) during the ECQ.

It is essential that alternative modes of delivery of ARVs, such as through courier or parcel services, be considered at the time of the ECQ, and that such cost of services may be charged to the PhilHealth Outpatient HIV/AIDS Treatment (OHAT) Package reimbursement.

## **POLICY IN-FOCUS**

In order to ensure the safety of healthcare workers, the continuity of health services, and the prevention of further transmission of the virus, the DOH issued an Interim Guidelines on the Accommodation Arrangement for Health Workers during COVID-19 Health Emergency Response Period.
