
A COVID-19 Philippine Situationer

Highlights and Recent **Updates on COVID-19**

- DOH recorded 8,033 active cases as of May • 08, with the majority of the patients exhibiting mild symptoms (7005, 86.7%).
- De La Salle University Cavite is now licensed to perform RT-PCR testing for COVID-19. There is a total of 24 licensed RT-PCR laboratories while five (5) and thirty (30) are on Stage 4 and Stage 3, respectively.
- As of yesterday, the country's COVID-19 ٠ positivity ratio is at around 7% (May 8). In contrast, the positivity ratio during early stages of the outbreak reached as high as 16%. The decline in positivity rate may serve as a basis for determining whether the country's health system is flattening the curve.
- DOH expects a decrease in the number of positive cases as test allocations expand towards testing patients with asymptomatic to mild symptoms.
- Dr. Edsel Salvana of the Technical Advisory Group of IATF emphasized the vital role of tracing, treatment, and isolation in preventing further transmission of the virus.
- DOH encourages the public to embrace the • New Normal setting in their everyday lives. In this renewed consciousness, the public needs to keep in mind that their practices and behaviors should lead to improved health. In relation to this, minimum health standards in offices/workplaces are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe.
- DOH reiterated that those with mild symptoms should stay home. Those with mild symptoms may consult through telemedicine, while those with severe symptoms must contact local BHERT or the DOH hotline.





Most of the confirmed cases are **male** (5,670; 24%) and within the **20-39 age group.** (*11 cases with unspecified age included in the total*)




Average hospital length of stay for recovered patients is at **15 days.**

A total of 386 **(55%)** of deaths had known comorbidities: top 2 comorbidities are **hypertension** (240, 62 %) and **diabetes** (188,49%).



Goal: Increase Resilience, Stop Transmission, Reduce Contact

BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES OF THE DAY

As of May 08, 2020

- As the country ushers into the New Normal era, minimum health standards are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe. In <u>office/workplace settings</u>, everyone should maintain a healthy diet, exercise daily for at least 15 minutes, talk regularly with friends and loved ones, and sleep for at least 7-8 hours a day.
- Before entering the workplace, everyone should see to it that they are checked for symptoms.
- To prevent possible spread of disease, everyone should wear face masks, practice hand hygiene and proper coughing manners, and maintain a 1-meter distance from others. The workplace must be regularly disinfected, especially regularly used objects such as keyboards and doorknobs.
- Those with mild symptoms should stay at home and are advised to consult through telemedicine, while those with severe symptoms must contact local BHERT or the DOH hotline.
- For those who need to go outside, it is advised to bring the following essentials: face mask, alcohol, quarantine pass, grocery/errands checklist, water, and tissue. Visit the <u>Healthy Pilipinas</u> website for more information.
- To avoid heat stroke during quarantine, those working and/or staying at home are advised to <u>maintain a cool temperature inside</u> <u>their homes</u> by closing windows and putting curtain over them, turning off and unplugging appliances not being used, hanging wet towels inside rooms, closing doors and windows (for air conditioned rooms), and most importantly, staying hydrated.



HOW DO YOU MAKE 0.05% DISINFECTANT SOLUTION FOR CLEANING HOUSEHOLD ITEMS?



1. Gather all materials needed: disinfectant container, bleach/chlorine, water, personal protective equipment



2. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment (gloves, googles, apron and boots) when handling and preparing bleach solutions.



1 kutsara (20g) ng chlorine 20 L tubig



3. When preparing the solution, pour the amount of water required into a plastic container then add the bleach (and not the other way around):

4. If you are using household bleach (5% active chlorine), mix:

- a) 1 ml bleach + 9 ml water, or
- b) 100 ml bleach + 900 ml water
- c) For chlorine powder/granules/tal


powder/granules/tablet (60-70%) active chlorine, dissolve: 1 tbsp of chlorine + 20L of water

5. Do not forget to label your disinfectant containers and specify chlorine concentration.



TREATMENT

For case management of COVID-19 patients, healthcare providers are advised to adhere to the existing <u>PSMID Guidelines</u>.

The country is participating in the Solidarity Trial that uses four (4) treatment regimen: (1) Remdesivir (2) Chloroquine/ Hydroxychloroquine (3) Lopinavir + Ritonavir (4) Lopinavir + Ritonavir + Interferon beta-1a.
