Highlights and Recent Updates on COVID-19

- DOH recorded **8,743 active cases** as of May 06, with the majority of the patients exhibiting **mild symptoms** (6967, 86.2%).
- DOH certified Jose B. Lingad Memorial Regional Hospital and Eastern Visayas Regional Medical Center as Stage 5 laboratories that can perform the RT-PCR tests for COVID-19. There is now a total of 26 licensed RT-PCR laboratories across the country while three and 29 are on Stage 4 and Stage 3 certification, respectively.
- Overall capacity to manage and admit COVID-19 patients is adequate with more than 50% beds and mechanical ventilators in ICU, isolation, and COVID wards available.
- According to DFA data, there are a total of 2,140 confirmed cases of Overseas Filipinos (OFs), the highest count being in Europe, at 647 confirmed cases.
- A total of 1,991 (19% of all cases) healthcare workers are affected by COVID-19, with 544 recoveries and 34 deaths.
- DOH underscores the importance of embracing the New Normal setting in their everyday lives. In this renewed consciousness, the public needs to keep in mind that their practices and behaviors should lead to improved health. In relation to this, minimum health standards in school are essential to maintain health and safety.
- DOH also appealed to the public to applaud, not discriminate, frontliners. DOH enjoins the public to continue looking after the welfare of healthcare workers and their families.
- Testing capacity should be increased through continued certification and capacity-building of laboratories alongside use of alternative testing strategies. With this, DOH issued Department Memorandum No. 2020-0191 or Designation of Selected Regional TB Culture Laboratories for GeneXpert Diagnosis of COVID-19.









Active Cases Breakdown




Healthcare Workers with confirmed COVID-19 by Date of Onset of Illness (N= 1,991)

Most of the confirmed cases are male (5741; 54%) and within the 20-39 age group. (13 cases with unspecified age included in the total)




Average hospital length of stay for recovered patients is at 15 days.




A total of 388 (55%) of deaths had known comorbidities: top 2 comorbidities are hypertension (240, 62%) and diabetes (188, 49%).

A total of 6916 (65%) are confirmed cases from NCR. The proportion of cases in NCR decreased from 71% since January to April 19, 2020 (start of case detection) to 56% for the period of April 20 to May 9, 2020.

Meanwhile, cases in **Region 7** increased in proportion from 2% to 30% for the similar period. On April 20, 2020, 124 (50%) out of the 249 confirmed cases nationwide, were reported from BJMP facility in Cebu City. Region 7 recorded a total of 1,421 (13%) confirmed cases, the second highest reported in the country.


Region 4-A has the third highest cases with a total of 1,257 (12%) confirmed cases of yesterday. Since start of case detection, the proportion of cases in Region 4A decreased from 16% to 7% for the period of April 20 to May 9.





BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES OF THE DAY

As of May 09, 2020

- As the country ushers into the New Normal era, minimum health standards are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe. As a general advisory, everyone should take care of their mental health. In <u>school settings</u>, everyone should maintain a healthy diet, exercise daily for at least 15 minutes, talk regularly with friends/loved ones, and sleep for at least 7-8 hours a day.
- To prevent possible spread of disease, everyone should wear face masks, practice hand hygiene and proper coughing manners, and maintain physical distancing. The school must be regularly disinfected, especially regularly-used objects.
- If possible, students and staff should study/work from the safety of their homes. Before entering school premises—only if necessary—everyone should see to it that they are checked for symptoms. Those with mild symptoms should stay at home and are advised to consult through telemedicine, while those with severe symptoms must contact local BHERT or the DOH hotline.
- Everyone is also advised to know how to deal with heat stroke. To ease the situation: (1) the victim should be laid down with their feet elevated, (2) their temperature should be brought down using a fan, (3) apply cold compress, and (4) have the victim drink fluids. For further management, they should be brought to the nearest health facility.
- While the country is battling COVID-19, everyone should applaud, not discriminate, frontline workers. DOH enjoins the public to continue looking after the welfare of healthcare workers and their families.



HOW DO YOU REMAIN SAFE AND HEALTHY AMIDST THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC?

ALWAYS remember and practice the following:



Wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds or more (Try singing the chorus of your favorite song while washing).



Use a hand sanitizer with 70% alcohol if you can't wash your hands for 20 seconds or more.



Avoid touching your face, especially your mouth, eyes, nose.



Make sure you keep 1 meter distance from other people.



Avoid touching things that many people touch like door handles, tables, chairs, etc.



Wear a mask while outside.



Frequently clean surfaces in your house, work or business. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keys, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.



Disinfect using a bleach solution (7 tablespoons [100 mL] bleach for 1 liter of clean water).




Disinfect your most used things (like phone, keys, eyeglasses, keyboard, etc.) with 70% alcohol solution.

HOSPITAL BEDS AND MECHANICAL VENTILATORS DEDICATED TO COVID-19 CASES




