## Highlights and Recent Updates on COVID-19

- DOH recorded 9,447 active cases as of May 20, with the majority of the patients exhibiting mild symptoms (8,501; 90%).
- A total of 2,330 (18% of all cases)
   healthcare workers have been affected by
   COVID-19, with 1,049 recoveries.
- Thirty-one (31) licensed laboratories are equipped to perform the RT-PCR test for COVID-19 while seven (7) laboratories are now licensed to perform COVID-19 testing using GeneXpert cartridges.
- Based on WHO data, **USA** is the country with the **highest number of confirmed cases** (1,477,459) in the world.
- As of May 20, a total of 442 repatriate
   vessels have been processed. Of these, 57
   vessels have arrived with a total of 14, 334
   repatriates under quarantine directly
   supervised by BOQ for monitoring and PNP
   for security, while 365 vessels with a total of
   19,392 repatriates are under quarantine
   directly supervised by OWWA for monitoring
   and PCG for security. There are currently 94
   vessels being processed.
- As of reporting, 184 facilities have requested for additional healthcare workers under the DOH's emergency hiring program.
- DOH has redeployed a total of 1,129 nurses under the Nurse Deployment Program in DOH and LGU hospitals handling COVID-19 cases.
- DOH underscores the importance of adjusting to the New Normal setting.
   Everyone is encouraged to regularly disinfect belongings, especially regularly-used items such as phone, remote control, computer keyboard, mouse, keys, etc.










### Healthcare Workers with confirmed COVID-19 by Date of Onset of Illness (N= 2,330)



## **Goal: Shortening Duration of Infectiousness**

### Age and Sex Distribution of confirmed cases





Most of the confirmed cases are Male (7,160 or 54%). Most cases are within the 20-39 age group. Seventy-four cases (28-female; 46-male) with unspecified ages are included in the total.



Average hospital length of stay for recovered patients is at **17 days.** 





A total of 452 (54%) deaths had known comorbidities: top 2 comorbidities are hypertension (281 or 62%) and diabetes (212 or 47%).

### **Date of Onset of Illness**

8,565 (65%) of the confirmed cases are from NCR. The proportion of cases in NCR has decreased from 72% (for the period March 20 to April 19) to 60% (for the period April 20 to May 20). However, on May 5, 2020, 143 cases were reported in NCR—the highest since April 11.

Meanwhile, cases in Region 7 increased in proportion from 2% to 22% for in the same period. On May 4, 2020, 123 (51%) out of the 242 confirmed cases nationwide (by date of onset) were reported from various barangays in Cebu City. Region 7 has recorded a total of 1,795 (14%) confirmed cases, the second highest reported in the country.

Region 4-A has the third highest number of cases with a total of 1,430 (11%) confirmed cases as of yesterday. Since the start of case detection, the proportion of cases in Region 4A has decreased from 15% to 6% for the period of April 20 to May 20.

### **BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES OF THE DAY**

As of May 20, 2020

- As the country ushers into the New Normal era, minimum health standards are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe.
   Everyone is encouraged to regularly disinfect belongings, especially regularly-used items such as phones, keys, etc.
- Everyone is also advised to be in-the-know about the symptoms of COVID-19. Should these symptoms show, individuals must immediately contact the local BHERT or DOH hotline.
- As more repatriates return to the country, the importance of quarantine protocols should be emphasized. While under quarantine, repatriates should practice proper handwashing, cough etiquette, wearing of mask, and should adhere to physical distancing measures.
- Everyone is enjoined in appreciating and applauding frontline health care workers, and people must recognize that the HCWs themselves have emotions and limitations – they should not have to face discrimination.
- Despite the country's focus being on the pandemic, other illnesses, such as tuberculosis, still have to be prioritized. TB research must continue so long as everyone handling specimens maintain their safety by wearing PPE and practicing proper handwashing.

Difficulty breathing



Shortness of breath



Persistent pain or pressure in the chest

Pale, bluish face and lips



### HOSPITAL BEDS AND MECHANICAL VENTILATORS DEDICATED TO COVID-19 CASES


