Highlights and Recent Updates on COVID-19

- DOH recorded **9,918 active cases** as of May 24, with the majority of the patients exhibiting **mild symptoms** (9,050; 91.3%).
- Hypertension** and **diabetes** are the top two (2) **comorbidities** of those who have been infected with COVID-19.
- A total of **2,394** (17% of all cases) **healthcare workers** have been affected by COVID-19, with **1,153 recoveries** and 31 deaths.
- As of May 24, a total of **476 repatriate vessels** have been processed. Of these, **58 vessels** have arrived with a total of **14,338 repatriates** under quarantine directly supervised by BOQ for monitoring and PNP for security, while **418 vessels** with **21,197 repatriates** are under quarantine directly supervised by OWWA for monitoring and PCG for security. There are currently **101 vessels** being processed.
- As of reporting, **202 health facilities** have requested for additional healthcare workers under the DOH's emergency hiring program.
- DOH has approved a total of **6,802 slots** for hiring in **202 health facilities**. DOH has redeployed a total of **1,175 NDP nurses** (185 in Luzon and 990 in Visayas and Mindanao) to DOH and LGU hospitals catering COVID-19 cases.
- DOTr, LTFRB, and LTO have been giving **free rides to healthcare workers** from different access points to respective health facilities. A total of **258 units** have been deployed and a total of 920,570 ridership nationwide.
- DOH encourages the public to **maintain good health** in the midst of a pandemic. Everyone is advised to eat healthy and to avoid junk food. The *Pinggang Pinoy* is also promoted to boost one's health and resistance.

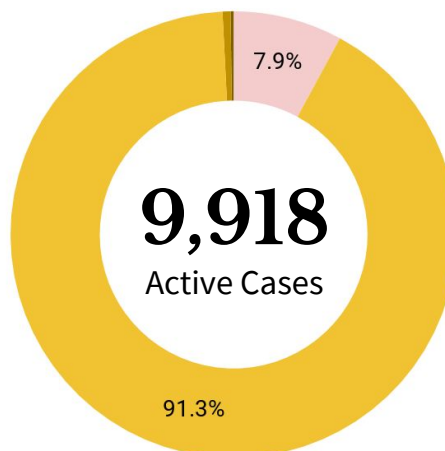

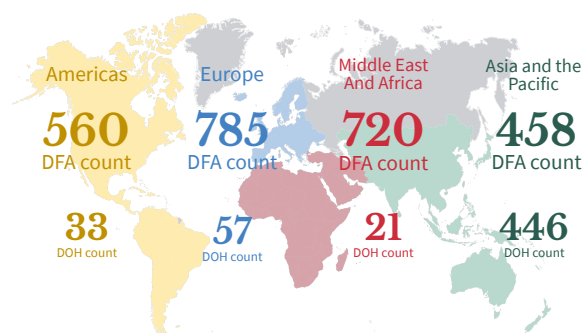

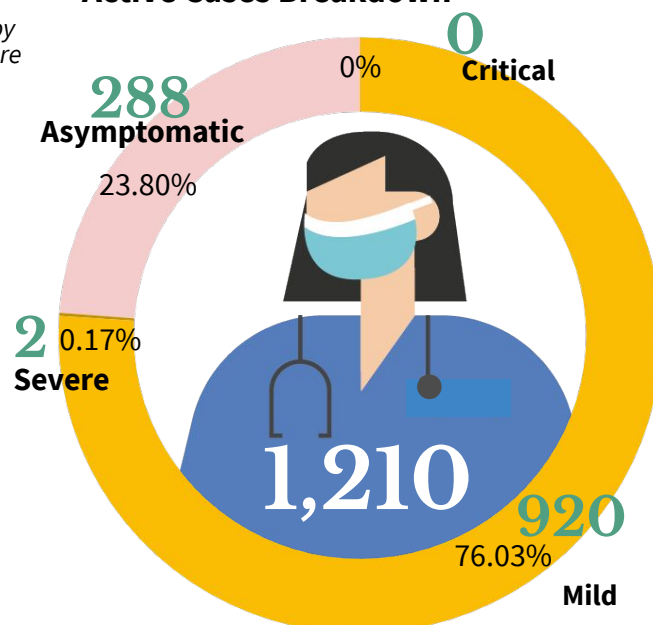

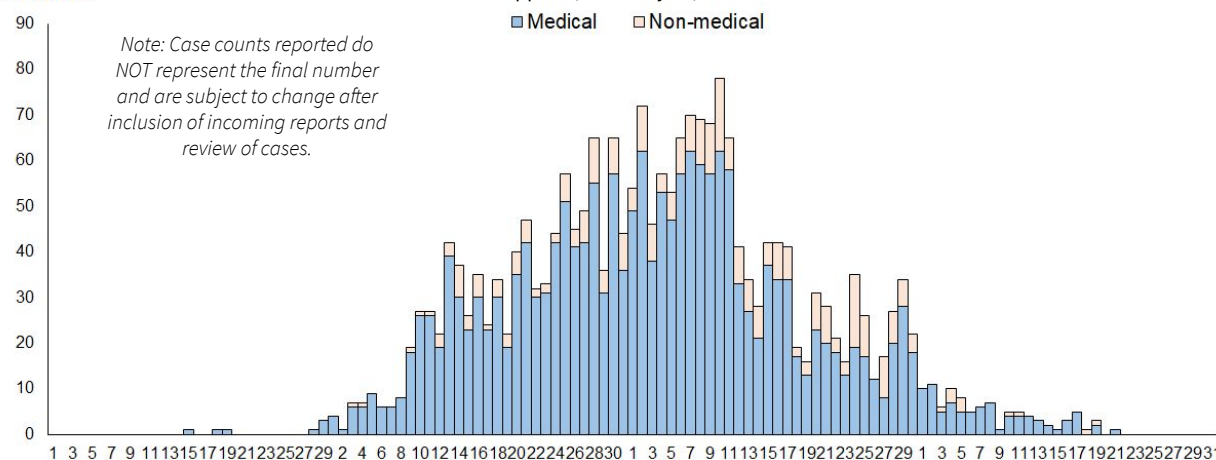

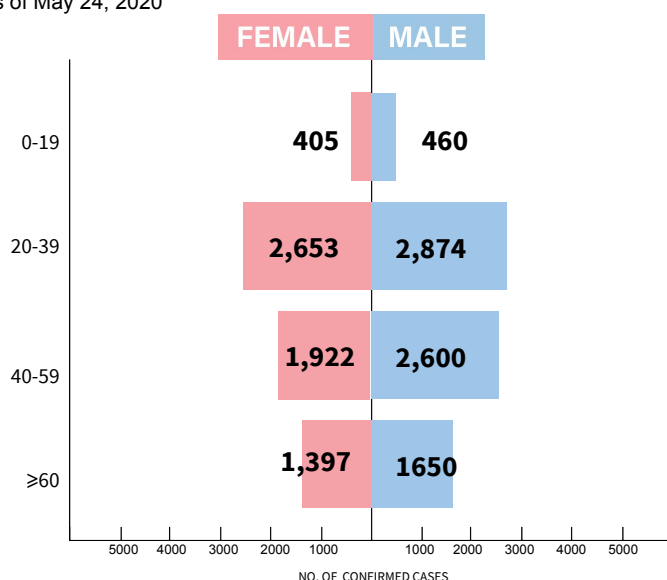

Most of the confirmed cases are Male (7630 or 54%). Most cases are within the 20-39 age group. Seventy-four cases (28-female; 46-male) with unspecified age are included in the total.



Average hospital length of stay for recovered patients is at **17 days**.



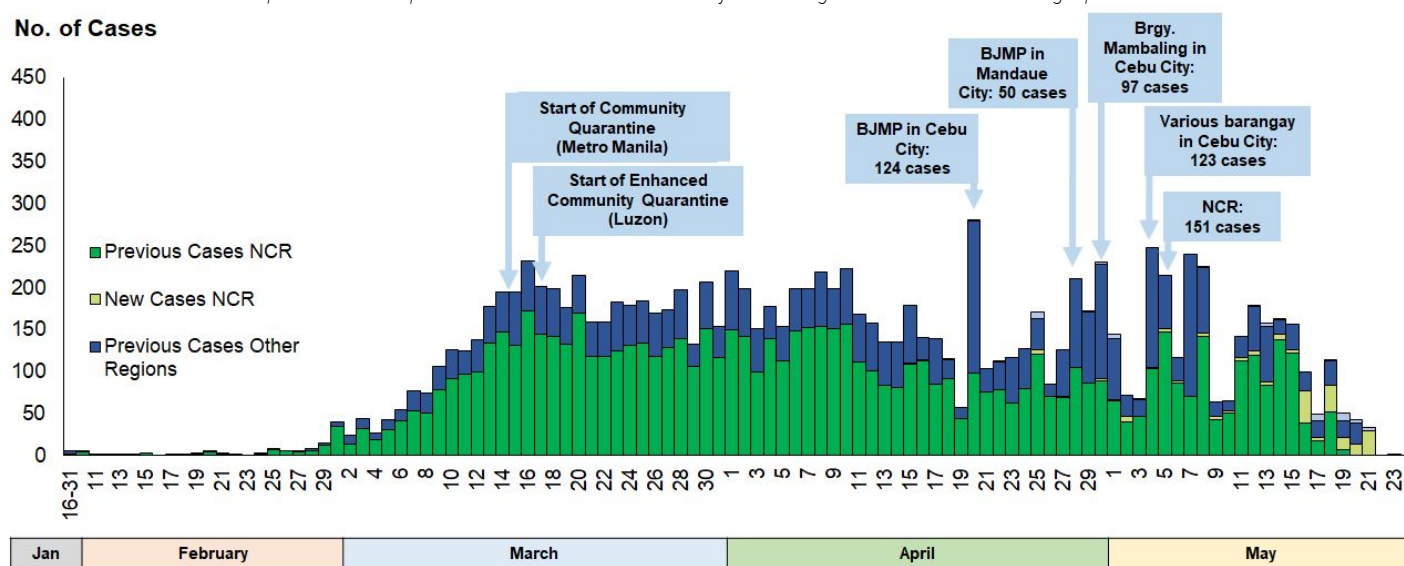
A total of 453 (52%) deaths had known comorbidities: top 2 comorbidities are hypertension (281 or 62%) and diabetes (212 or 47%).

Confirmed COVID-19 Cases by Date of Onset of Illness (N = 14,035)

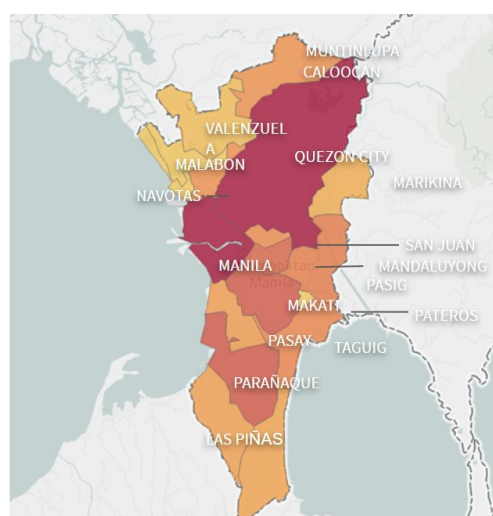

A total of 9,063 (65%) are confirmed cases from NCR. The proportion of cases in NCR decreased from 72% since January (start of case detection) to April 19, 2020 to 60% for the period of April 20 to May 24, 2020. However, on May 5, 2020, 151 cases were reported in NCR—highest since April 11.

Meanwhile, cases in Region 7 increased in proportion from 2% to 21% for the similar period. On May 4, 2020, 123 (50%) out of the 247 confirmed cases nationwide (by date of onset), were reported from various barangay in Cebu City. Region 7 recorded a total of 1,949 (14%) confirmed cases, the second highest reported in the country.

Region 4-A has the third highest cases with a total of 1,471 (10%) confirmed cases as of yesterday. Since start of case detection, the proportion of cases in Region 4A decreased from 15% to 6% for the period of April 20 to May 24.

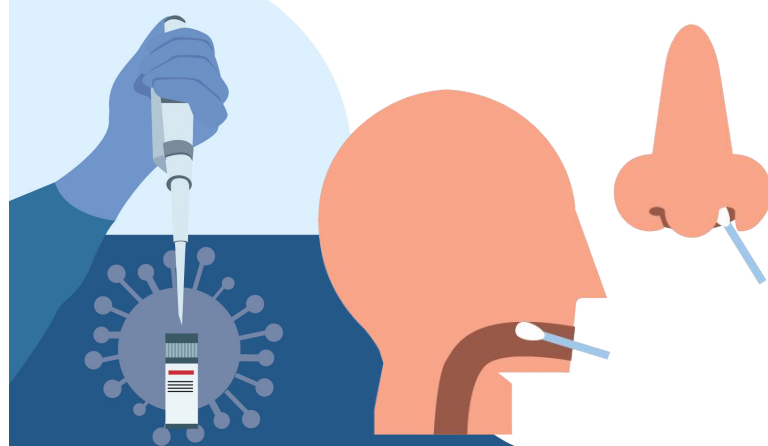

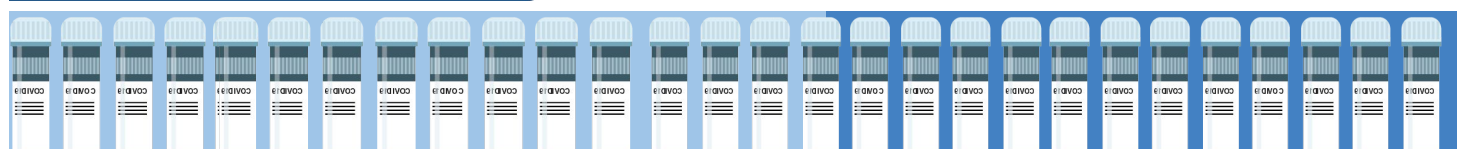

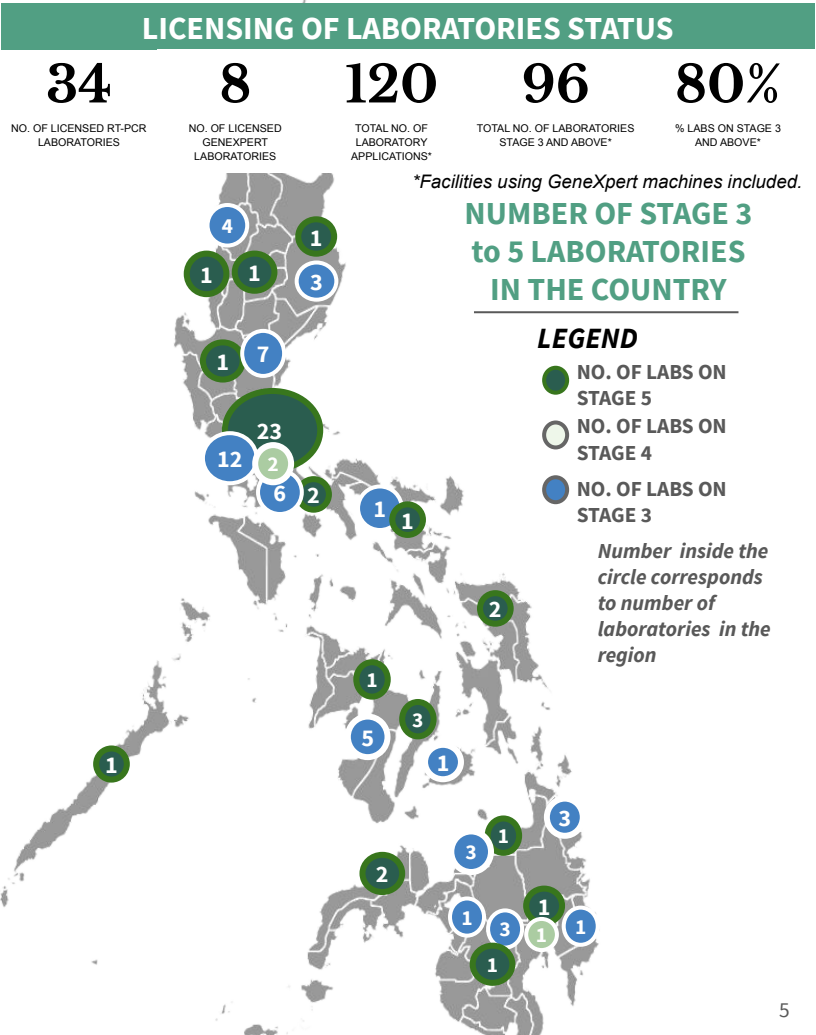

BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES OF THE DAY

As of May 24, 2020

- As the country ushers into the New Normal era, minimum health standards are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe. In [offices/workplaces](#), everyone is encouraged to eat nutritious food, exercise at least 15 minutes daily, and get enough sleep. Quintessential safety measures should also be in place: face masks should be worn at all times, hand hygiene should be maintained, and physical distancing should be strictly observed. Items and spaces in the workplace should be regularly disinfected. Employees should be checked for symptoms before entering the workplace. For those with mild symptoms, staying at home is advised, while in worse cases, they must contact local BHERT or DOH hotline.
- To maintain good health in the midst of a pandemic, everyone is advised to [eat healthy](#) and to avoid junk food. The Pinggang Pinoy is also promoted to boost one's health and resistance. In the same vein, exercising at least three times a week is advised to maintain good health.
- Everyone should be careful in sharing claims about COVID-19, especially now that the country is entering the New Normal era. With this, the public is encouraged to [be careful with what they see on social media](#).
- As more repatriates return to the country, the importance of quarantine protocols should be emphasized. While under quarantine, repatriates should practice proper handwashing, cough etiquette, wearing of mask, and should adhere to physical distancing measures.

HOW DO YOU MAKE 0.05% DISINFECTANT SOLUTION FOR CLEANING HOUSEHOLD ITEMS?

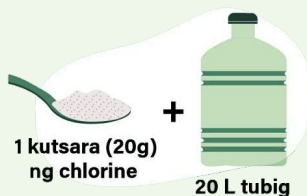


1. Gather all materials needed: disinfectant container, bleach/chlorine, water, personal protective equipment



3. When preparing the solution, pour the amount of water required into a plastic container then add the bleach (and not the other way around):

2. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment (gloves, goggles, apron and boots) when handling and preparing bleach solutions.



4. If you are using household bleach (5% active chlorine), mix:

- 1 ml bleach + 9 ml water, or
- 100 ml bleach + 900 ml water
- For chlorine powder/granules/tablet (60-70% active chlorine, dissolve: 1 tbsp of chlorine + 20L of water

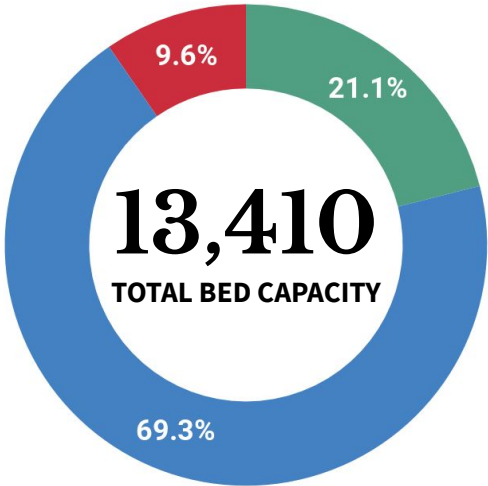

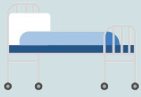

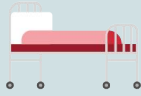

FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION (FDA)

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued FDA Circular No. 2020-017¹ to inform all concerned stakeholders and partners regarding the prohibition on the selling of essential emergency medicines and medical devices beyond the price ceiling/range set by the Department of Health Department Memorandum (DM) No. 2020-0058 dated 31 January 2020, DM No. 2020-0058-A dated 11 February 2020, DM No. 2020-0058-B dated 05 March 2020, and Department Circular 2020-0186 dated 15 April 2020 declaring the price freeze of essential emergency medicines and supplies in the entire country due to the 2019- Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

POLICY IN-FOCUS

In order to provide guidance to the different government offices for the safe repatriation of Overseas Filipinos, the Department of Health has issued Department Memorandum No. 2020-0182 entitled “Revised Interim Guidelines on the Mass Repatriation and Mandatory Quarantine of Land-based Overseas Filipinos (OFs) during the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Pandemic³.”

The goal of these guidelines is to repatriate and accommodate all the incoming OFs from land-based employment, following the President’s directives, and at the same time, maintaining precautions so as to prevent the risk of importing COVID-19 cases from abroad.
