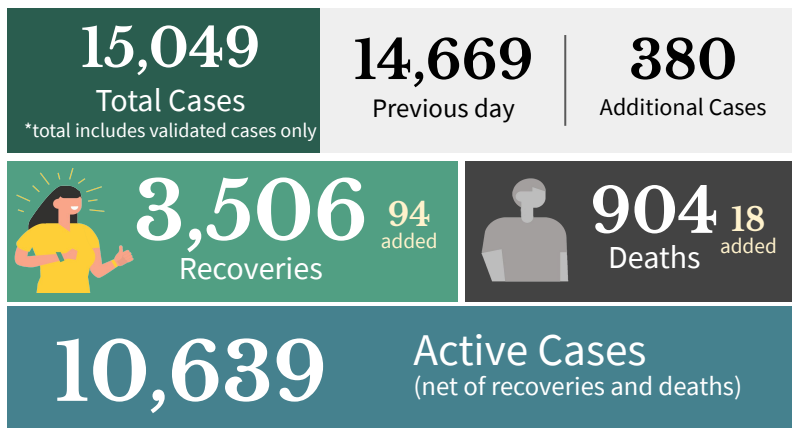

Highlights and Recent Updates on COVID-19

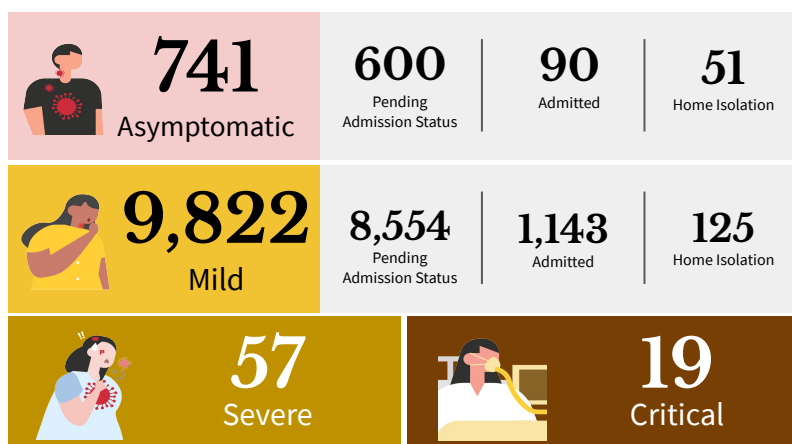
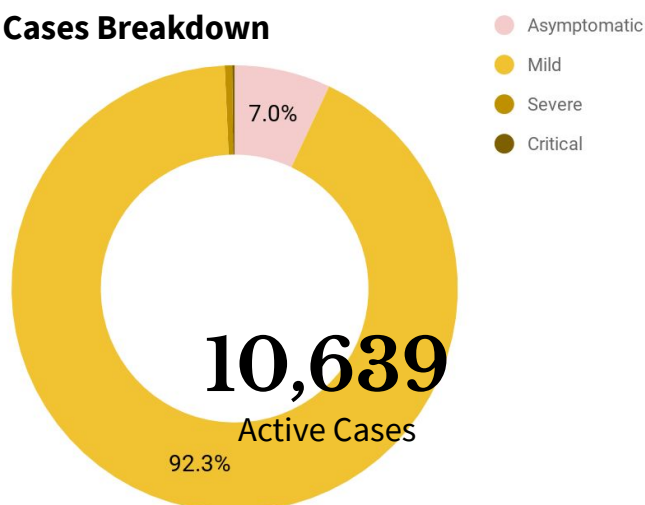
- DOH recorded **10,639 active cases** as of May 27, with the majority of the patients exhibiting **mild symptoms** (9,822; 92.3%).
- Thirty-four (34) licensed laboratories** are equipped to perform the **RT-PCR test** for COVID-19 while **nine (9) laboratories** are licensed to use **GeneXpert cartridges**.
- DOH recorded 94 additional patients who have recovered from the disease, bringing the **total number of COVID-19 survivors to 3,506**.
- As DepEd prepares measures to ensure that quality education is accessible to every Filipino while also ensuring utmost protection against the threat of COVID-19, DepEd has aligned its **Basic Education Learning Continuity Plan** with the **DOH's minimum health and safety guidelines for COVID-19**. The four key areas include (1) increasing physical and mental resilience of both teachers and learners, (2) reducing transmission, (3) reducing contact, and (4) reducing the duration of infection; along with other strategies.
- DOH calls for more **healthcare workers to be heroes of World War C**. Now is the time to be a **BAYANi** and put **BAYAN** before the I. Applicants may visit bit.ly/HCW Hiring or the [DOH Facebook Page](#) for more information.
- DOH reiterates the need for the public to **adapt to the New Normal setting** to ensure health and safety. DOH urges everyone to **remain vigilant about their health** and practice handwashing, physical distancing, wearing of face masks, and cough etiquette as part of their lifestyle.

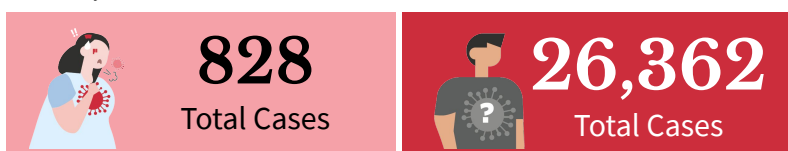


Active Cases Breakdown

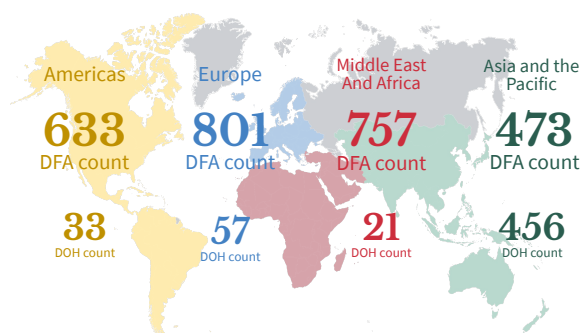
Case Summary of Overseas Filipinos (OFs)

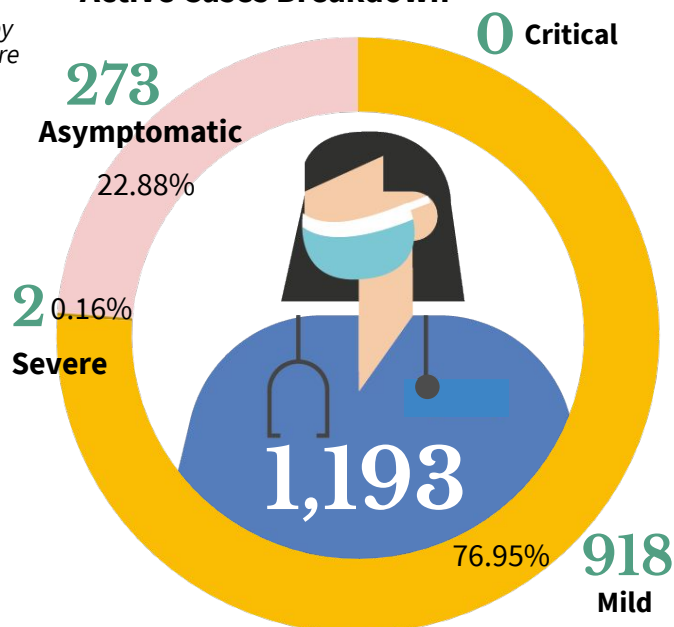

Active Cases Breakdown



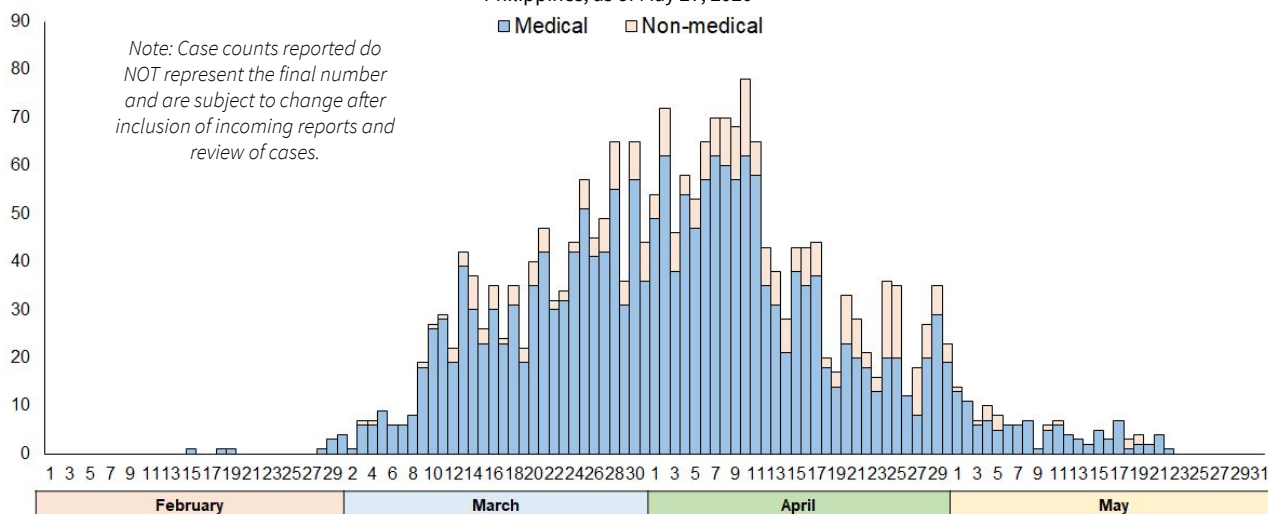
Healthcare Workers with confirmed COVID-19 by Date of Onset of Illness (N= 2,452)

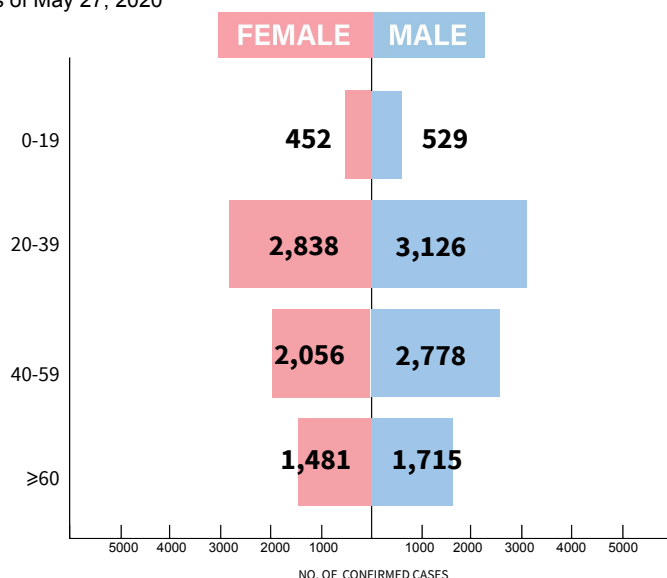

Most of the confirmed cases are Male (8,194 or 54%). Most cases are within the 20-39 age group. Seventy-four cases (28-female; 46-male) with unspecified age are included in the total.



Average hospital length of stay for recovered patients is at **17 days**.



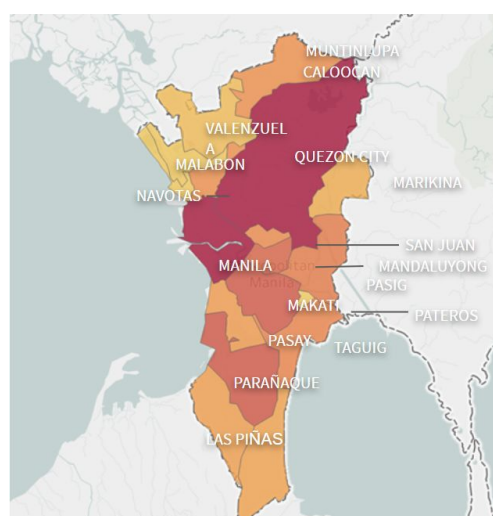
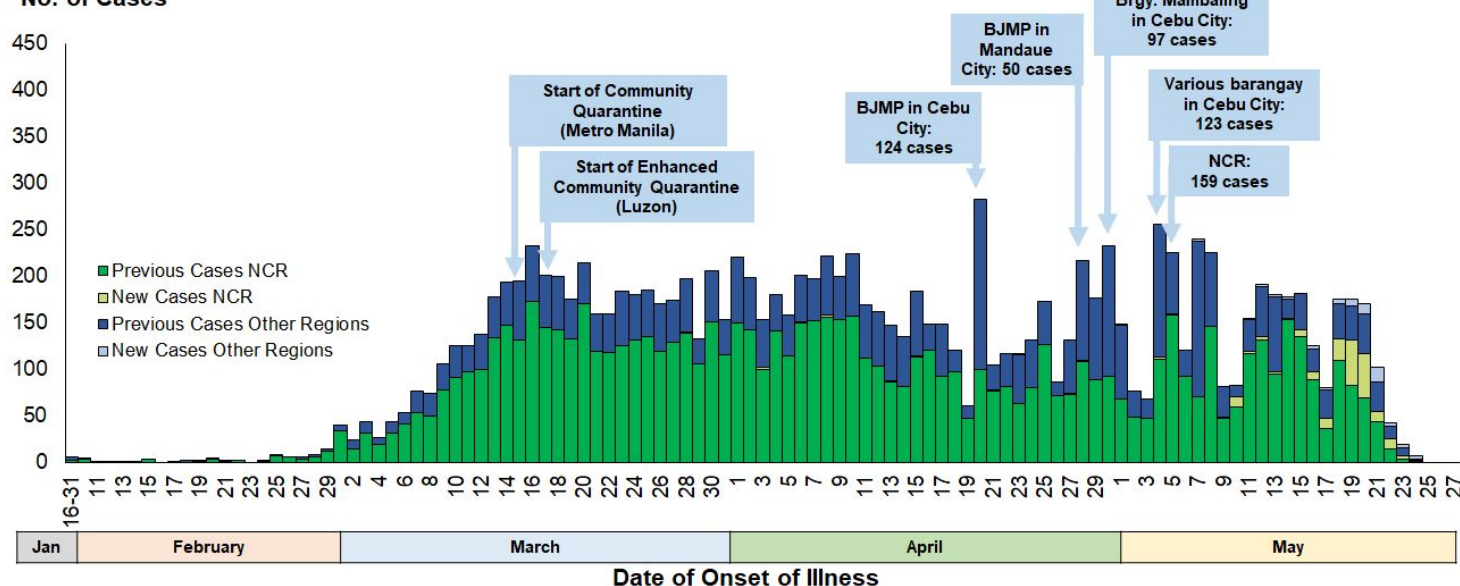
A total of 461 (51%) deaths had known comorbidities: top 2 comorbidities are hypertension (286 or 62%) and diabetes (215 or 47%).

A total of 9,721 (65%) are confirmed cases from NCR. The proportion of cases in NCR decreased from 72% since January (start of case detection) to April 19, 2020 to 61% for the period of April 20 to May 27, 2020.

However, on May 5, 2020, 159 (70%) cases were reported from NCR out of 226 cases nationwide.

Meanwhile, cases in Region 7 increased in proportion from 2% to 20% for the similar period. On May 4, 2020, 123 (48%) out of the 256 confirmed cases nationwide (by date of onset), were reported from various barangay in Cebu City. Region 7 recorded a total of 2,018 (13%) confirmed cases, the second highest reported in the country.

Region 4-A has the third highest cases with a total of 1,555 (10%) confirmed cases as of yesterday. Since start of case detection, the proportion of cases in Region 4A decreased from 15% to 6% for the period of April 20 to May 27.

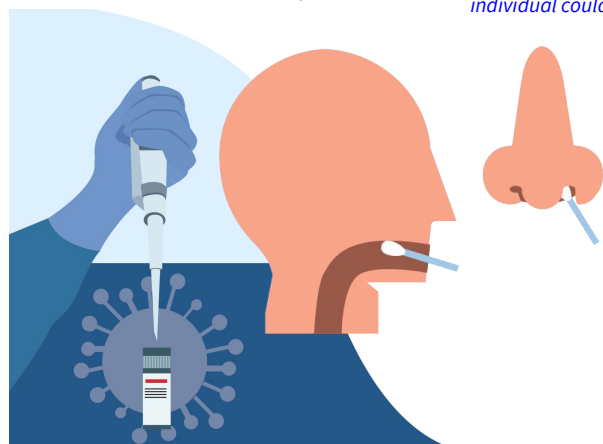

BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES OF THE DAY

As of May 27, 2020

- As the country ushers into the New Normal era, minimum health standards are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe. The government is looking for effective ways of studying at home to keep students and teachers safe. While studying at home, students are encouraged to eat a healthy diet and avoid food that are too salty, fatty, and sweet. Drink at least eight glasses of water daily.
- While areas in the Philippines are easing movement restrictions, general community quarantine will still be imposed in some places. Employees that are [returning to work](#) should stay safe and healthy by maintaining a healthy diet, exercising daily for at least 15 minutes, and sleeping for at least 7-8 hours a day. They should also practice wearing face masks, proper hand hygiene and proper coughing manners, and maintaining one-meter distance from others. Upon arriving in your home, take a bath first before interacting with your family.
- For repatriates travelling back home, physical distancing and wearing mask must be strictly observed in waiting areas of airports, seaports, and bus terminals.

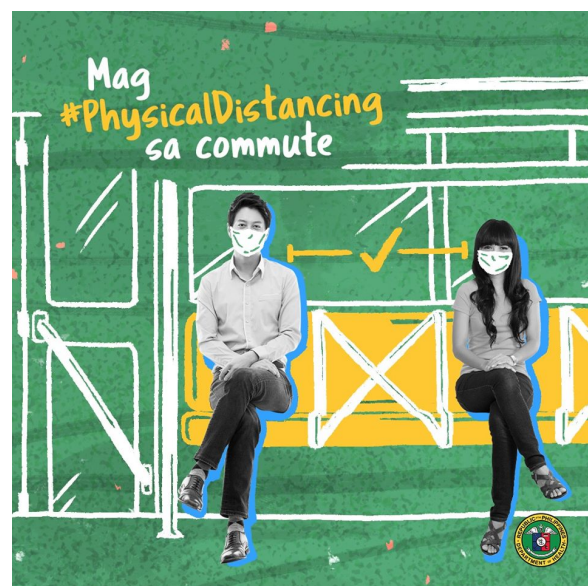

HOW DO YOU MAKE 0.05% DISINFECTANT SOLUTION FOR CLEANING HOUSEHOLD ITEMS?

1. Gather all materials needed: disinfectant container, bleach/chlorine, water, personal protective equipment

2. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment (gloves, goggles, apron and boots) when handling and preparing bleach solutions.



3. When preparing the solution, pour the amount of water required into a plastic container then add the bleach (and not the other way around):

4. If you are using household bleach (5% active chlorine), mix:

- 1 ml bleach + 9 ml water, or
- 100 ml bleach + 900 ml water
- For chlorine powder/granules/tablet (60-70%) active chlorine, dissolve: 1 tbsp of chlorine + 20L of water

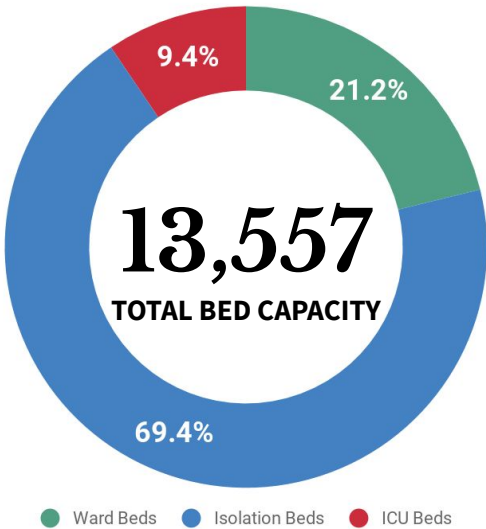
5. Do not forget to label your disinfectant containers and specify chlorine concentration.

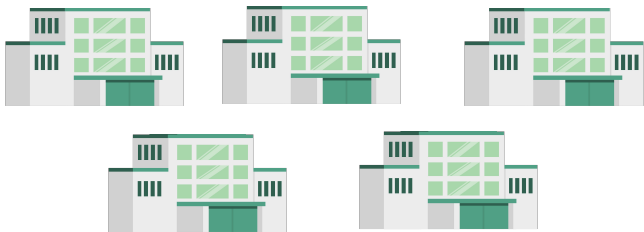

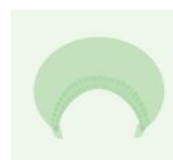

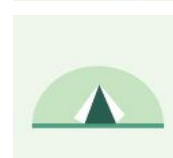

The Department of Health has issued Administrative Order No. 2020-0010 entitled “Regulations on the Conduct of Clinical Trials for Investigational Products ¹” to ensure the full protection of the rights and safety of human subjects and the integrity of clinical trial data through the adoption and implementation of International Council of Harmonization-Good Clinical Practice (ICH GCP) standards. The issuance also aims to ensure efficient and effective process for the approval of clinical trials, provide standards and requirements for the regulation and importation of Investigational Products, and strengthen the monitoring of compliance of all organizations, institutions and entities to GCP and other related FDA regulations through regulatory inspections.

POLICY IN-FOCUS

In order to provide guidance to the different government offices handling the remains of confirmed COVID-19 cases, the DOH has issued Department Memorandum No. 2020- 0158 “Proper Handling of the Remains of Suspect, Probable, and Confirmed COVID-19 Cases²”.

This DM is being issued to reiterate the proper handling of the remains of confirmed COVID-19 cases as stipulated under Department Memorandum 2020-0067 dated 03 February 2020 on the “Guidelines on the Disposal and Shipment of the Remains of Confirmed Cases of 2019 Novel Coronavirus Acute Respiratory Disease (2019-nCoV ARD) and to provide guidance on the proper handling of remains of suspect, probable, and confirmed COVID-19 cases”.
