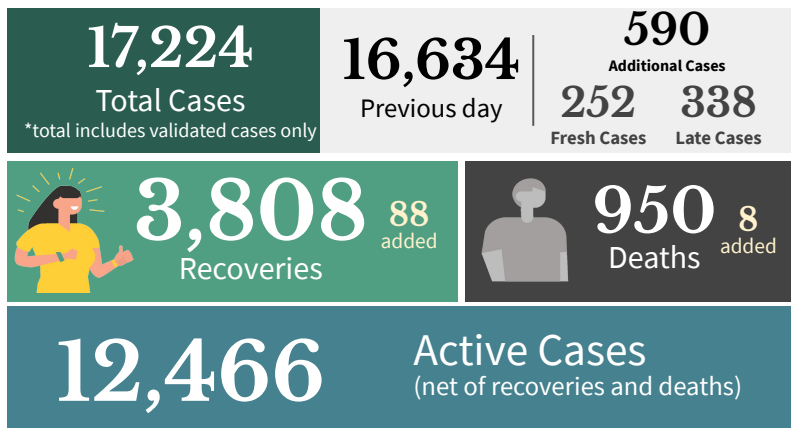

Highlights and Recent Updates on COVID-19

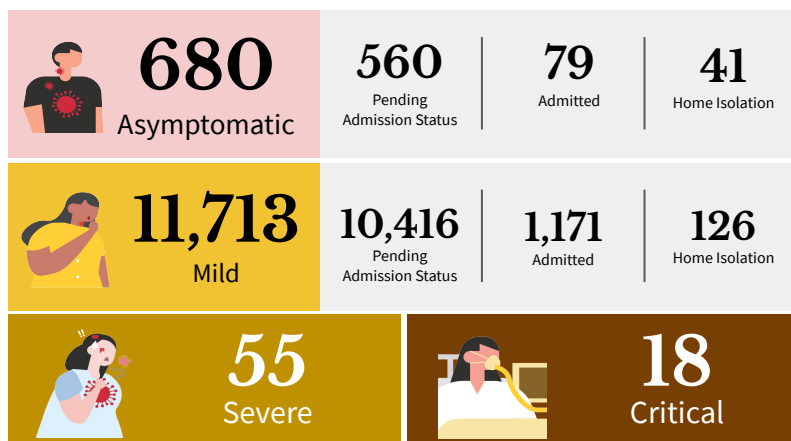
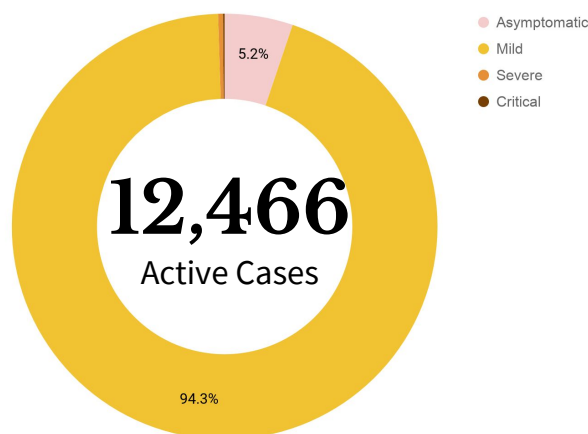
- DOH recorded **12,466 active cases** as of May 30, with the majority of the patients exhibiting **mild symptoms** (11,713; 94%).
- A total of **2,560** (15% of all reported cases) **healthcare workers** have been affected by COVID-19, with **1,342 recoveries** and 32 deaths.
- As of May 30, a total of **571 repatriate vessels** have been processed. Of these, **61 vessels** have arrived with **14,417 repatriates** under quarantine directly supervised by BOQ for monitoring and PNP for security, while **510 vessels** with **22,390 repatriates** are under quarantine directly supervised by OWWA for monitoring and PCG for security. There are currently **138 vessels** being processed.
- As of reporting, **207 health facilities** have requested for additional healthcare workers under the DOH's emergency hiring program.
- DOH has approved a total of 6,749 slots for hiring in 207 facilities. DOH has redeployed a total of **1,308 NDP nurses** (204 in Luzon and 1,104 in Visayas and Mindanao) to DOH and LGU hospitals handling COVID-19 cases.
- As today is World No Tobacco Day, the DOH emphasized that **smoking** increases the **risk for COVID-19** infection and complication.
- Tomorrow, June 1, is the start of the **General Community Quarantine** (GCQ) scheme in Metro Manila. The DOH reiterates that this is not yet the time to be complacent. Everyone should still observe wearing of face mask, maintaining a safe distance, frequent washing of hands, and following cough etiquette.

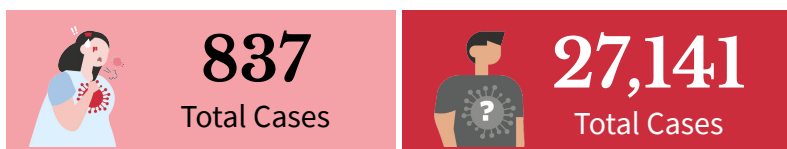


Active Cases Breakdown

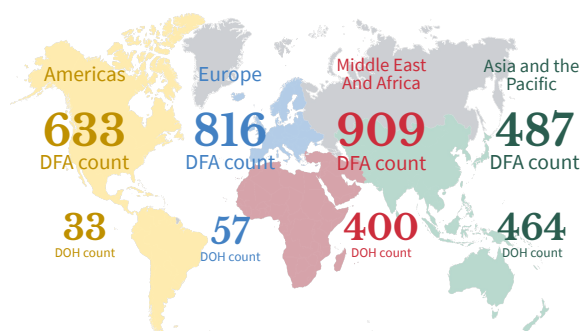
Case Summary of Overseas Filipinos (OFs)

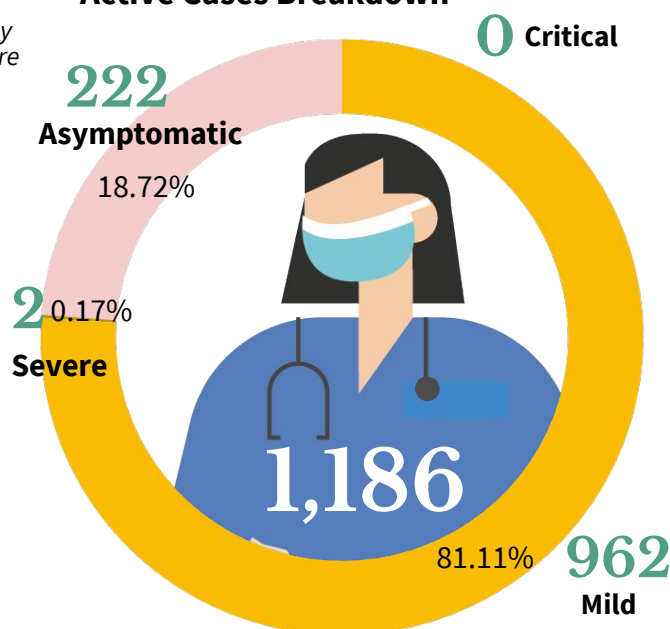
Healthcare Workers affected by COVID-19

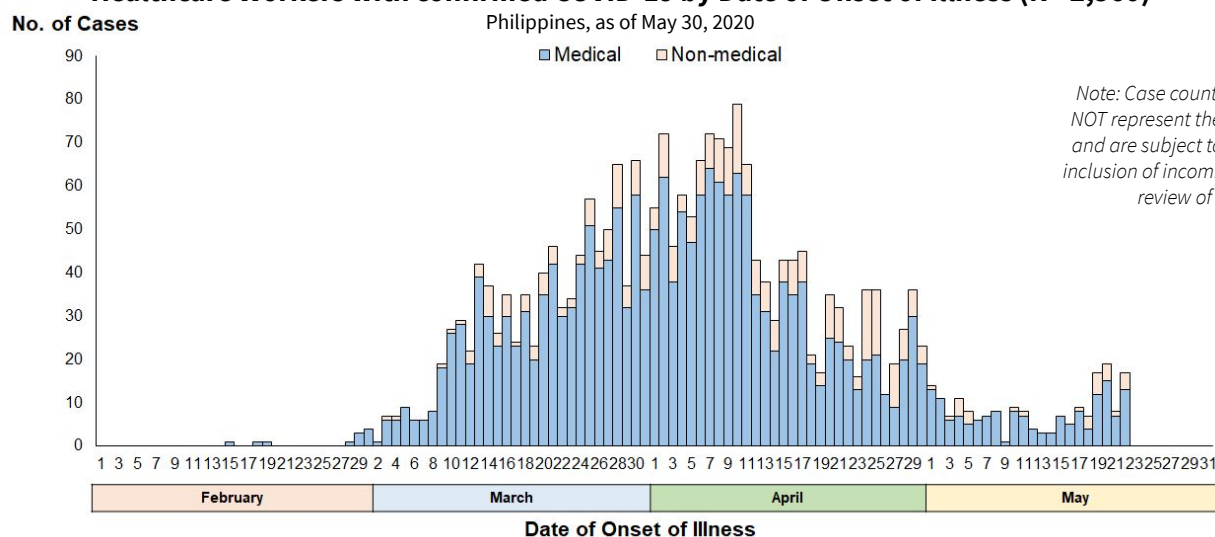

Healthcare Workers with confirmed COVID-19 by Date of Onset of Illness (N= 2,560)

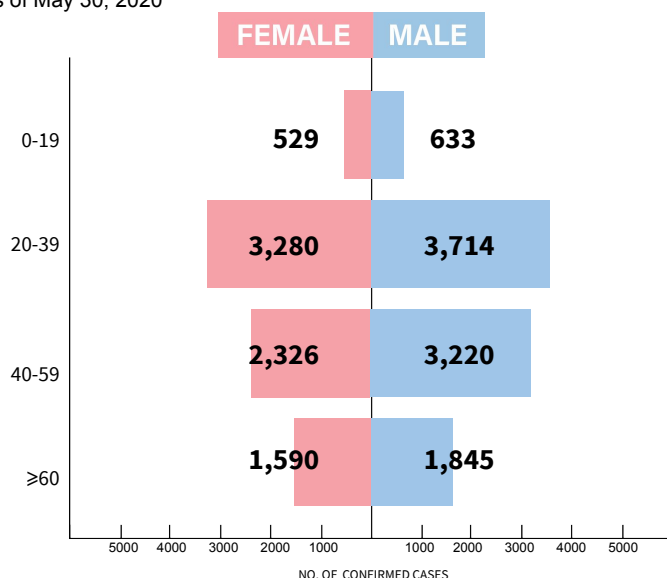

Most of the confirmed cases are Male (9470 or 55%). Most cases are within the 20-39 age group. Eighty-seven cases (29-female; 58-male) with unspecified age are included in the total.



Average hospital length of stay for recovered patients is at **17 days**.



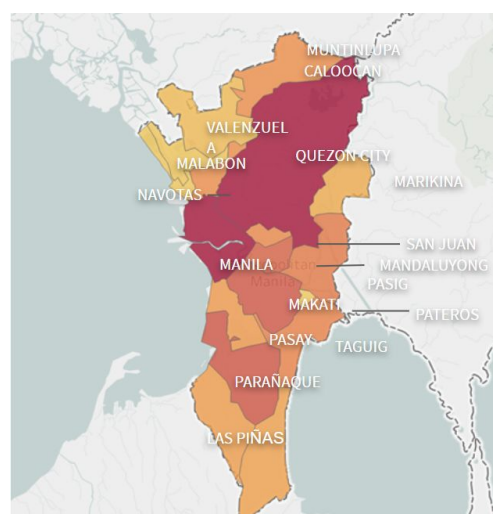
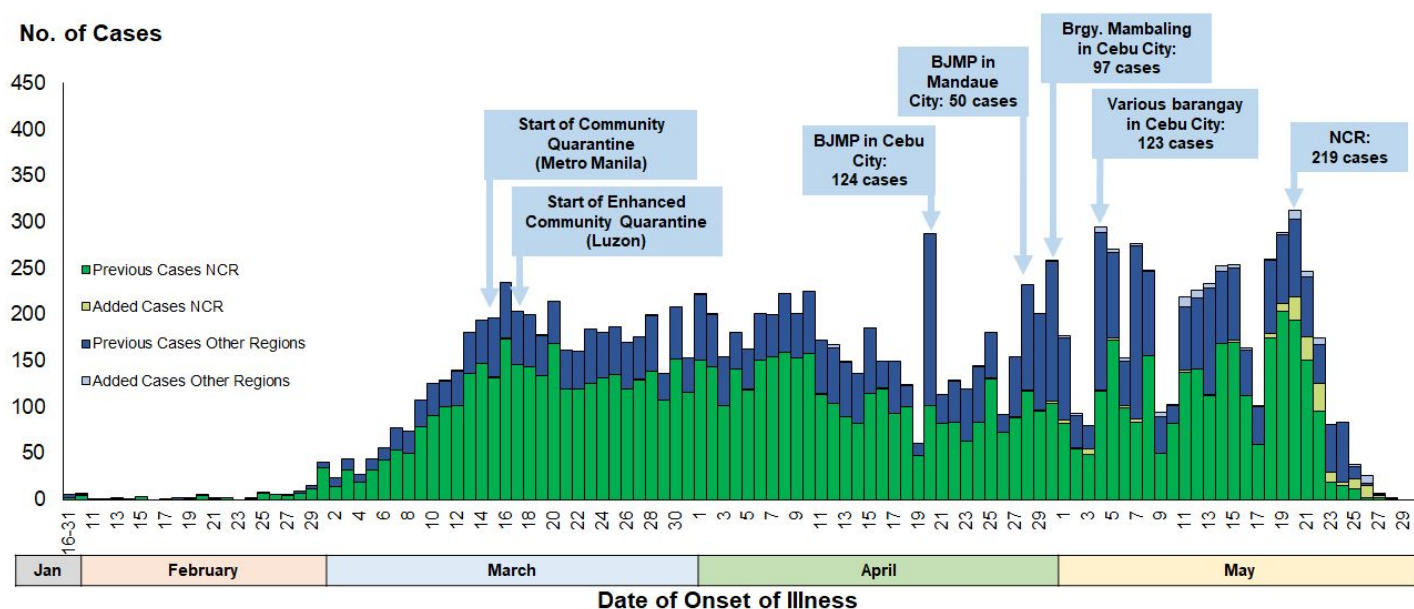
A total of 477 (50%) deaths had known comorbidities: top 2 comorbidities are hypertension (291 or 61%) and diabetes (220 or 46%).

A total of 10,870 (63%) are confirmed cases from NCR. The proportion of cases in NCR decreased from 72% since January (start of case detection) to April 19, 2020 to 59% for the period of April 20 to May 30, 2020.

Meanwhile, cases in Region 7 increased in proportion from 2% to 16% for the similar period. On May 4, 2020, 123 (42%) out of the 294 confirmed cases nationwide (by date of onset), were reported from various barangay in Cebu City. Region 7 recorded a total of 2,119 (12%) confirmed cases, the second highest reported in the country.

Region 4-A has the third highest cases with a total of 1,706 (10%) confirmed cases as of yesterday. Since start of case detection, the proportion of cases in Region 4A decreased from 15% to 6% for the period of April 20 to May 30.

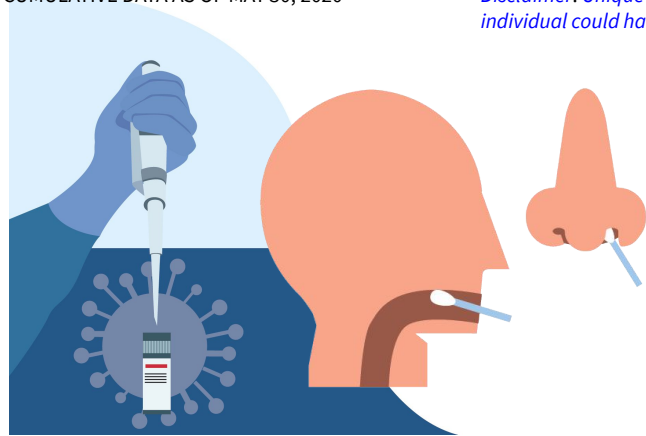

BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES OF THE DAY

As of May 30, 2020

- As the country ushers into the New Normal era, minimum health standards are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe. As we gradually shift from MECQ to GCQ, some public transportation will already be available. Those who have illnesses are discouraged from commuting to avoid possible spread of disease.
- Those who need to go out to finish errands are encouraged to abide by the [minimum health standards](#). As a general precaution, everyone should observe hand hygiene, proper coughing manners, physical distancing, and the use of face masks. From going out, arriving to your destination, and upon returning home, it is important to take measures to keep yourself and others safe.
- Minimum health standards in [hotels and inns](#) are also reiterated and should be followed at all times. If not necessary, staying in hotels and inns are discouraged.
- The repercussions of smoking are also emphasized as we observe World No Tobacco Day (May 31). Smoking is further discouraged since it increases risk for COVID-19 infection and complication.
- The public is enjoined in applauding and appreciating frontline health care workers. They are our allies and heroes in battling against COVID-19, and discrimination is something they shouldn't have to face.



HOW DO YOU REMAIN SAFE AND HEALTHY AMIDST THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC?

ALWAYS remember and practice the following:



Wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds or more (Try singing the chorus of your favorite song while washing).



Use a hand sanitizer with 70% alcohol if you can't wash your hands for 20 seconds or more.



Avoid touching your face, especially your mouth, eyes, nose.



Make sure you keep 1 meter distance from other people.



Avoid touching things that many people touch like door handles, tables, chairs, etc.



Wear a mask while outside.



Frequently clean surfaces in your house, work or business. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keys, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.



Disinfect using a bleach solution (7 tablespoons [100 mL] bleach for 1 liter of clean water).



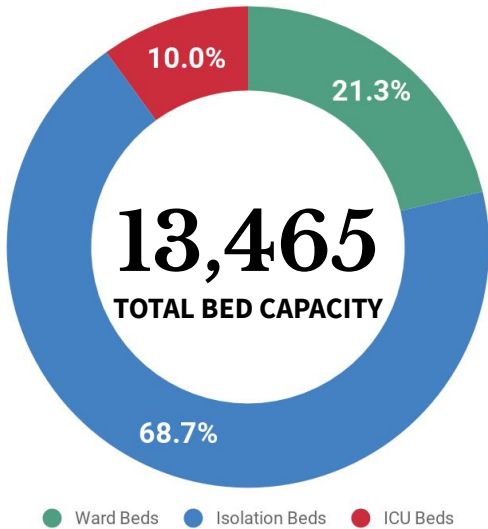
Disinfect your most used things (like phone, keys, eyeglasses, keyboard, etc.) with 70% alcohol solution.

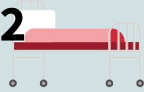
