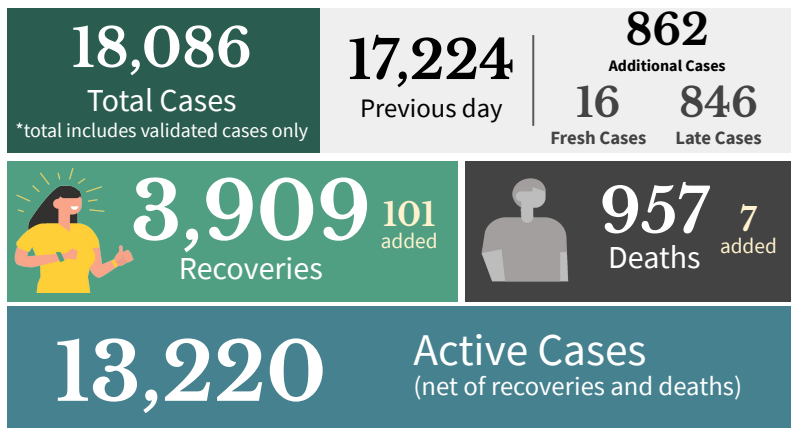

Highlights and Recent Updates on COVID-19

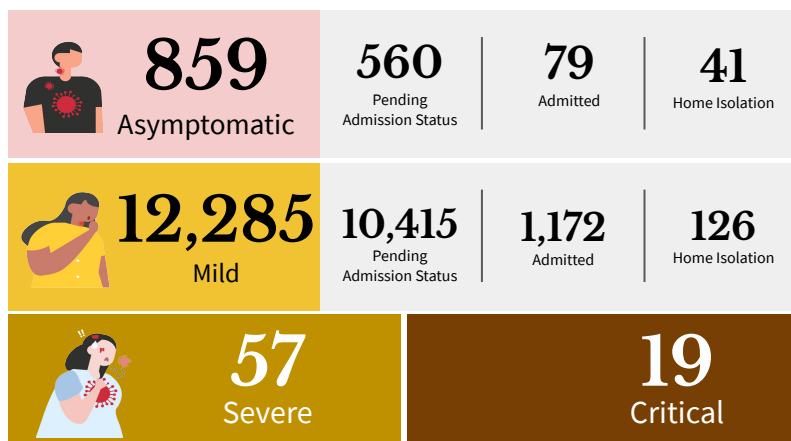
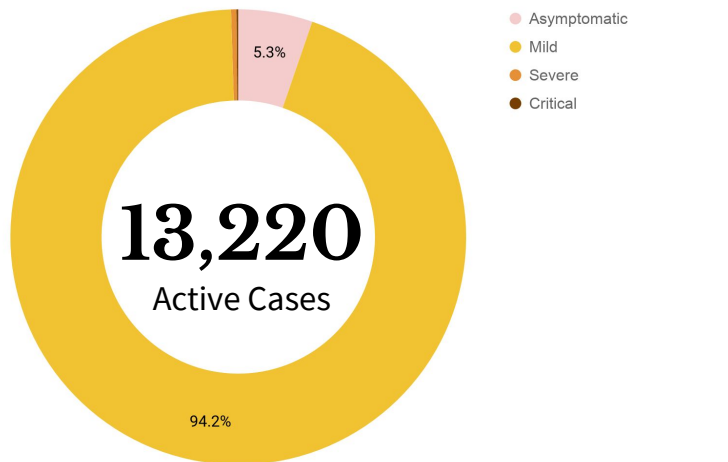
- DOH recorded **13,220 active cases** as of May 31, with the majority of the patients exhibiting **mild symptoms** (12,285; 92.9%).
- Thirty-eight (38) licensed laboratories** are now equipped to perform the **RT-PCR test** for COVID-19 while **eleven (11) laboratories** are licensed to use **GeneXpert cartridges**.
- A total of **2,606** (14% of all reported cases) **healthcare workers** have been affected by COVID-19, with **1,402 recoveries** and **32 deaths**.
- The Epidemiology Bureau (EB) of DOH announced that **all backlog cases for validation have already been cleared**. These are based on the complete line lists submitted by 27 operational licensed laboratories including the partial line list submitted by one (1) licensed laboratory, out of the 42 licensed laboratories that are currently in operation.
- DOH reformatted its case bulletin to indicate: (1) **“fresh” or recent cases** that refer to cases whose lab results were released within the last three days of the data of reporting; and (2) **“late” cases** that refer to cases with results released four days or more behind the date of reporting but are recently validated due to delayed submissions from the laboratories.
- DOH clarifies that the surge of “late” cases is attributed to **EB’s aggressive validation of recently-submitted line lists**. The validation process eliminates possible duplication in recording while also ensuring that all test results have been transmitted to the DOH. With this, DOH explains that the **increasing numbers do not mean that the COVID-19 situation in the country is worsening**.

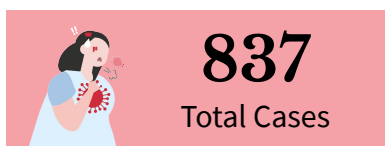


Active Cases Breakdown



Probable Cases

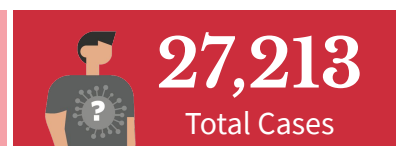

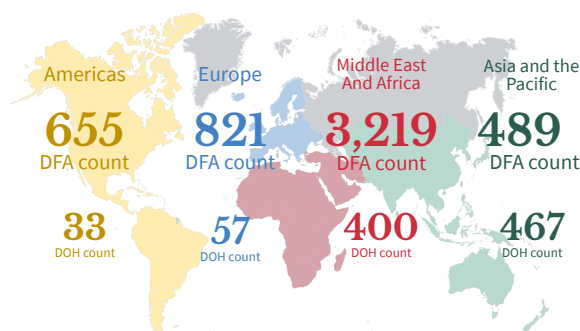
Case Summary of Overseas Filipinos (OFs)

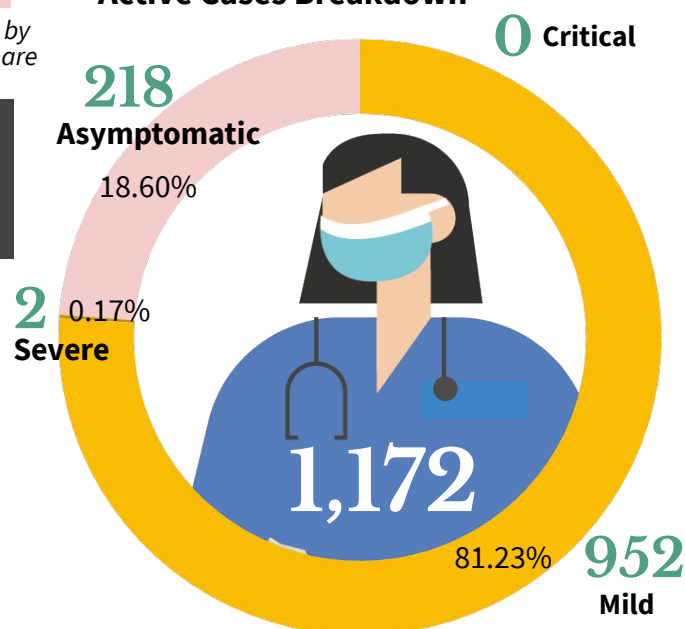

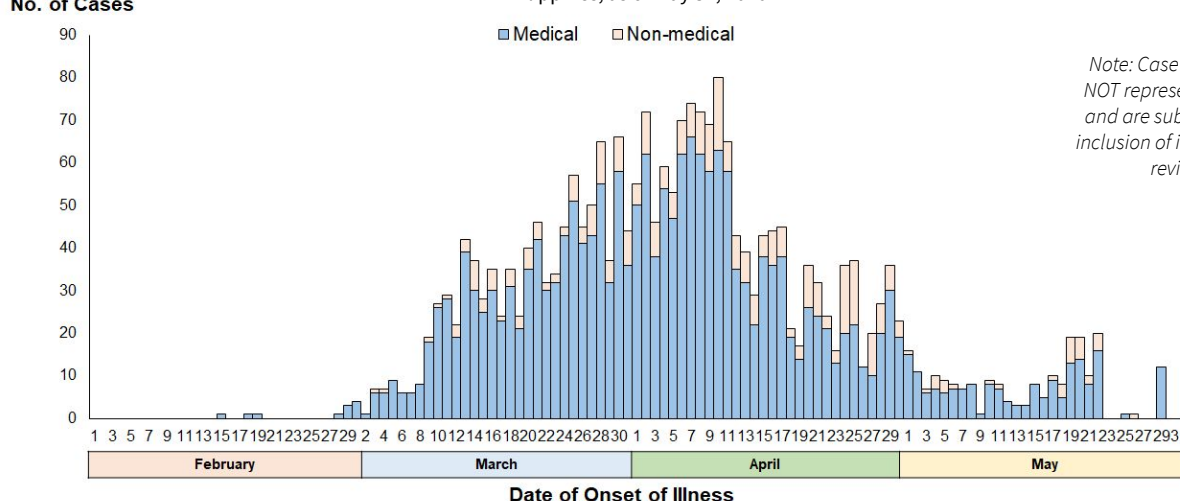

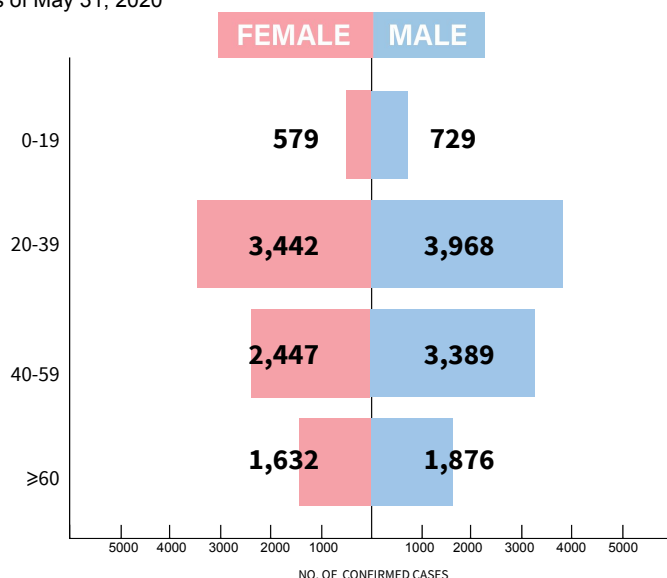

Most of the confirmed cases are Male (9978 or 55%). Most cases are within the 20-39 age group. Twenty-four cases (8-female; 16-male) with unspecified age are included in the total.



Average hospital length of stay for recovered patients is at **17 days**.



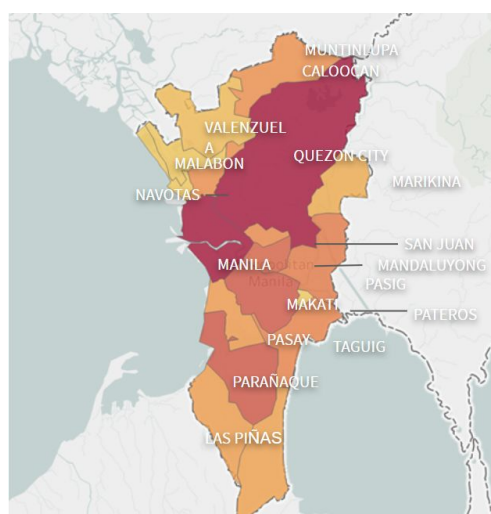
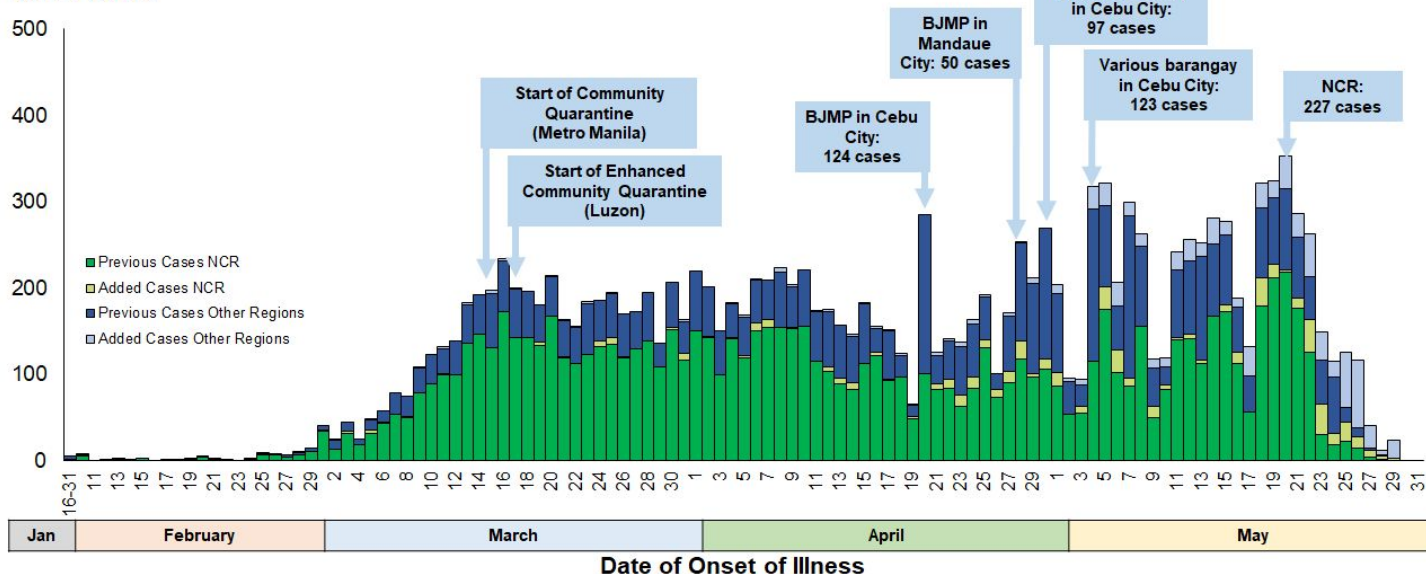
A total of 477 (50%) deaths had known comorbidities: top 2 comorbidities are hypertension (291 or 61%) and diabetes (220 or 46%).

A total of 11,003 (61%) are confirmed cases from NCR. The proportion of cases in NCR decreased from 72% since January (start of case detection) to April 19, 2020 to 55% for the period of April 20 to May 31, 2020.

Meanwhile, cases in Region 7 increased in proportion from 2% to 15% for the similar period. On May 4, 2020, 123 (39%) out of the 318 confirmed cases nationwide (by date of onset), were reported from various barangay in Cebu City. Region 7 recorded a total of 2,191 (12%) confirmed cases, the second highest reported in the country.

Region 4-A has the third highest cases with a total of 1,719 (10%) confirmed cases as of yesterday. Since start of case detection, the proportion of cases in Region 4A decreased from 15% to 6% for the period of April 20 to May 31.

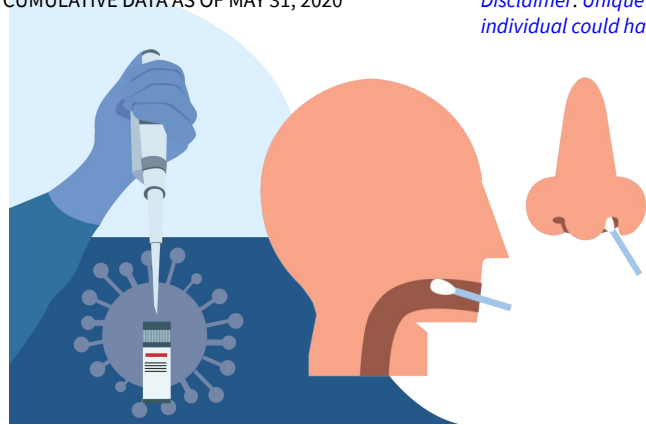

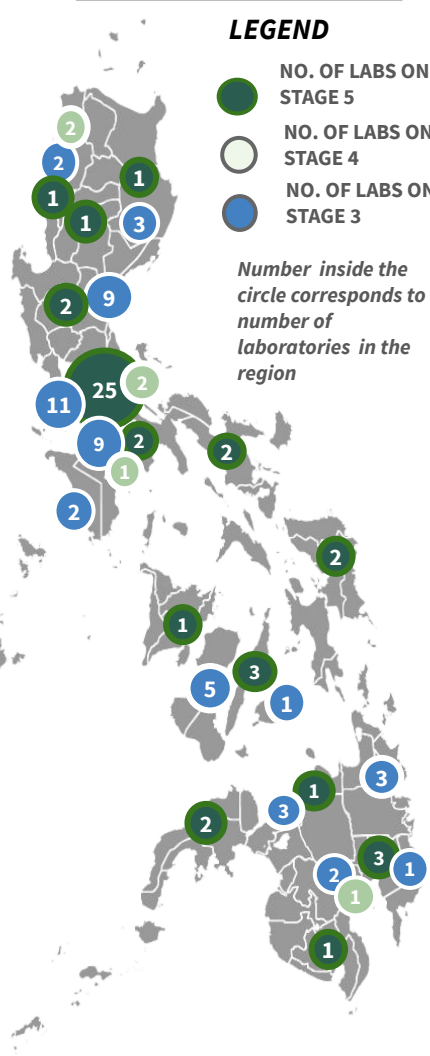

BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES OF THE DAY

As of May 31, 2020

- As the country ushers into the New Normal era, minimum health standards are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe. In GCQ & MGCQ areas, [visiting parks](#) and open spaces to do physical activities is allowed. - Employees or workers should be [checked for symptoms](#) before entering the workplace. Those with mild symptoms should stay at home and are advised to consult through telemedicine, while those with severe symptoms must contact local BHERT or the DOH hotline. In the office or workplace, everyone should wear face masks, practice hand hygiene and proper coughing manners, and maintain physical distancing to protect self from the virus.
- June is National No Smoking Month, with theme "Protect Filipino youth from the influence of tobacco industry!". Youth are encouraged to NEVER TRY smoking or vaping to be able to live a healthy, normal, and functional life.

HOW DO YOU MAKE 0.05% DISINFECTANT SOLUTION FOR CLEANING HOUSEHOLD ITEMS?



1. Gather all materials needed: disinfectant container, bleach/chlorine, water, personal protective equipment



2. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment (gloves, goggles, apron and boots) when handling and preparing bleach solutions.



3. When preparing the solution, pour the amount of water required into a plastic container then add the bleach (and not the other way around):

4. If you are using household bleach (5% active chlorine), mix:

- 1 ml bleach + 9 ml water, or
- 100 ml bleach + 900 ml water
- For chlorine powder/granules/tablet (60-70%) active chlorine, dissolve: 1 tbsp of chlorine + 20L of water

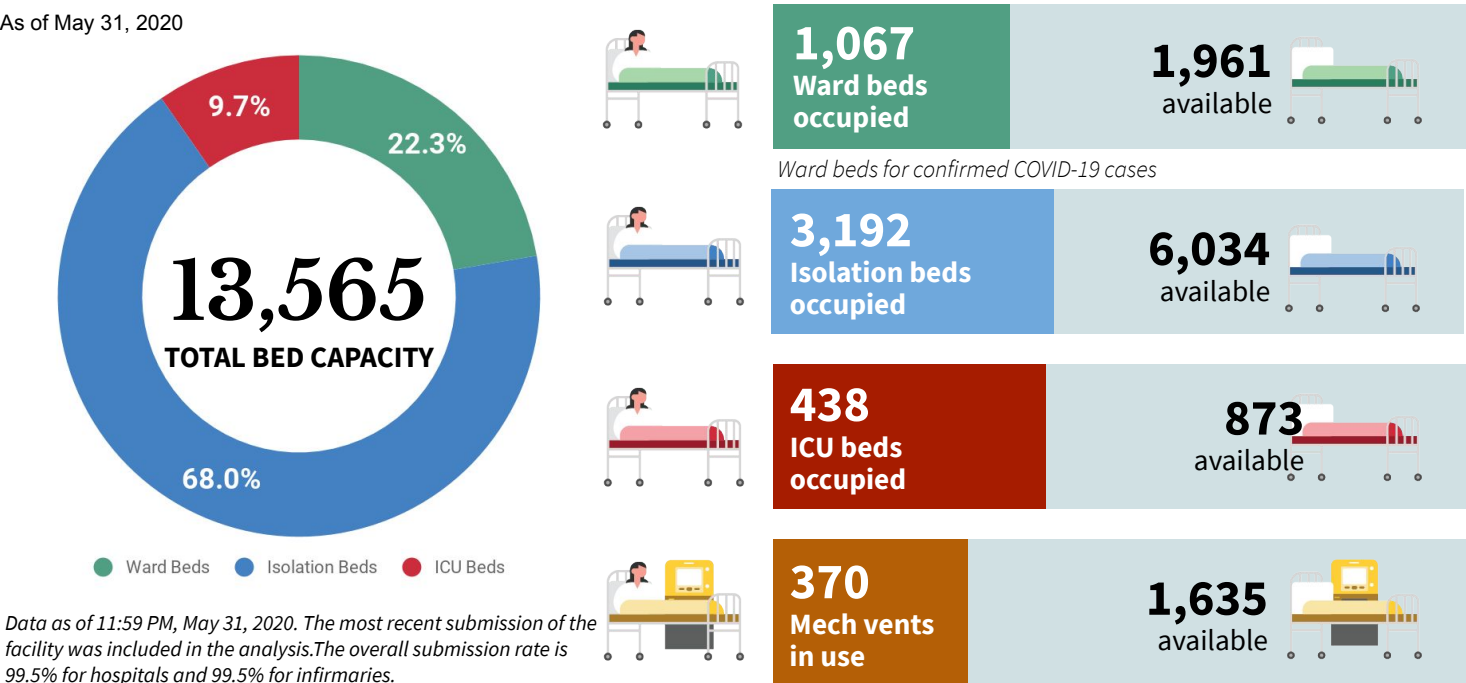
5. Do not forget to label your disinfectant containers and specify chlorine concentration.

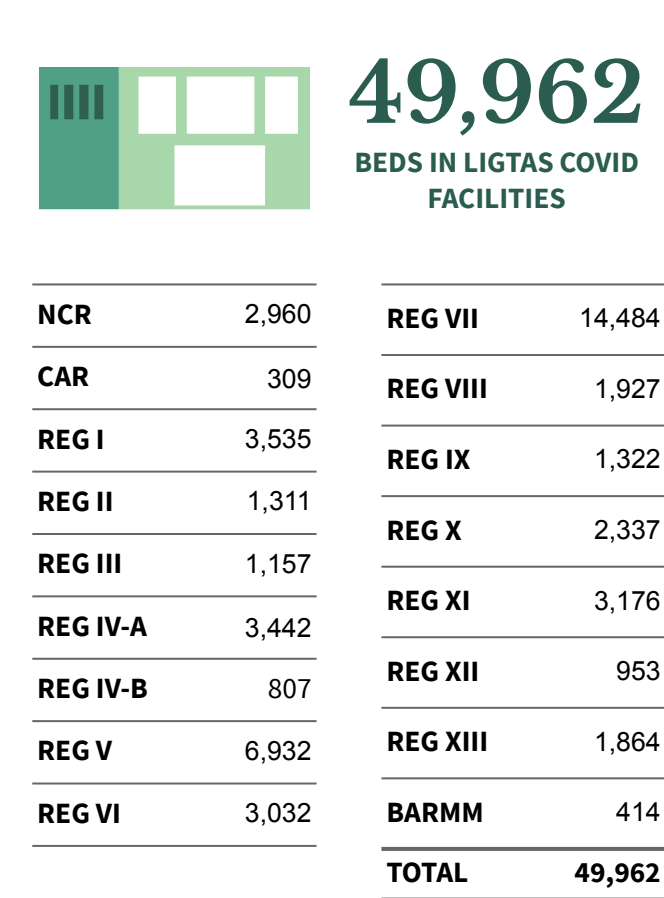

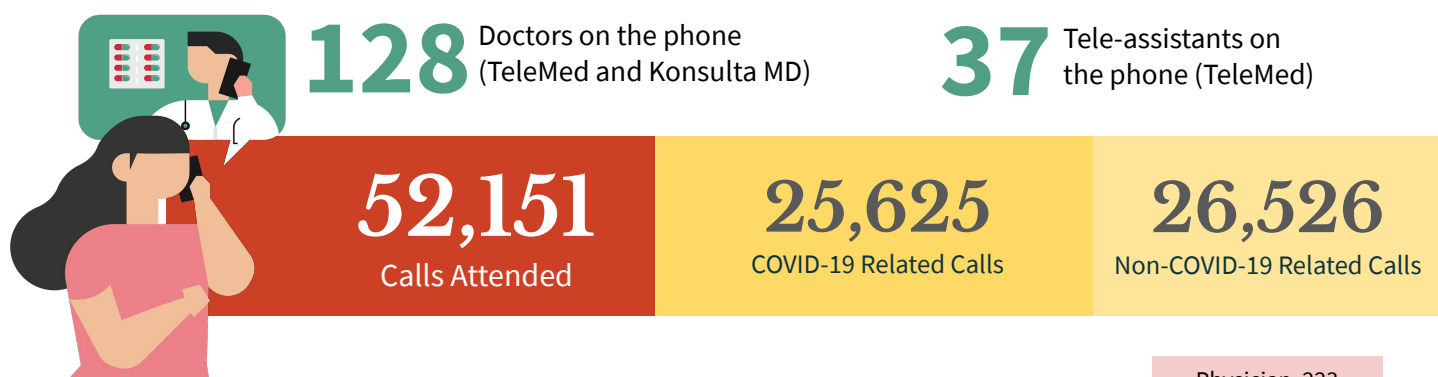

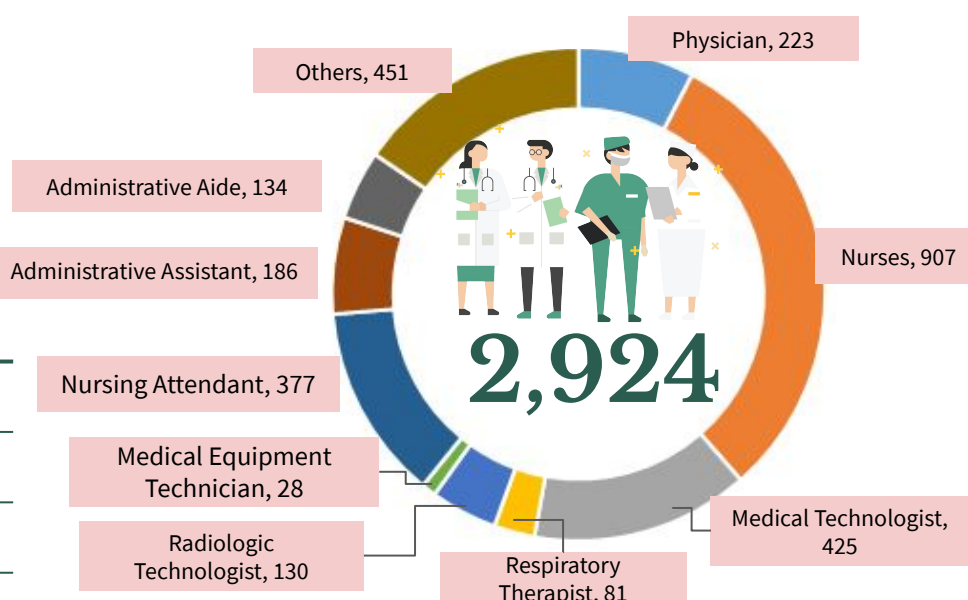
