Highlights and Recent **Updates on COVID-19**

- DOH recorded 13,969 active cases as of June 2, with majority of the patients exhibiting mild symptoms (13,095; 93.7%).
- A total of **2,675** (14% of all reported cases) are healthcare workers, with 1,457 recoveries and 32 deaths.
- Forty (40) licensed laboratories across the country are now equipped to perform the RT-PCR test for COVID-19 while 12 laboratories are licensed to perform COVID-19 testing using GeneXpert cartridges.
- Overall capacity to manage and admit COVID-19 patients is still sufficient with available beds and mechanical ventilators in ICU, isolation, and COVID wards based on information gathered from DOHDataCollectApp.
- As of June 2, a total of 50,175 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROF) have arrived (Land-based: 13,149; Sea-based: 37,026). Of this figure, 43,123 were released from facility quarantine (Land-based: 11,094; Sea-based:32,029). Among the ROF, 1,028 were confirmed COVID-19 (Land-based: 799; Sea-based: 229). Among the confirmed COVID-19 ROF, 480 are currently admitted (Land-based: 72; Sea-based: 158); 125 recovered; and 1 death.
- DOH reiterates the need for the public to embrace the New Normal setting. Everyone is encouraged to remove shoes, immediately change clothes, or take a bath when returning home.









Active Cases Breakdown





Most of the confirmed cases are Male (10,497 or 55%). Most cases are within the 20-39 age group. Twenty-six cases (9-female; 17-male) with unspecified age are included in the total.



Average hospital length of stay for recovered patients is at 17 days.





A total of 485 (50%) deaths had known comorbidities: top 2 comorbidities are hypertension (291 or 60%) and diabetes (223 or 46%).

A total of 11,195 (59%) are confirmed cases from NCR. The proportion of cases in NCR decreased from 72% since January (start of case detection) to April 19, 2020 to 55% for the period of April 20 to June 2, 2020.

Meanwhile, cases in Region 7 increased in proportion from 2% to 13% for the similar period. On May 4, 2020, 123 (35%) out of the 352 confirmed cases nationwide (by date of onset), were reported from various barangay in Cebu City. Region 7 recorded a total of 2,472 (12%) confirmed cases, the second highest reported in the country.

Region 4-A has the third highest cases with a total of 1,747 (9%) confirmed cases as of yesterday. Since start of case detection to April 19, the proportion of cases in Region 4A decreased from 15% to 6% for the period of April 20 to June 2.


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Goal: Increase Resilience, Stop Transmission, Reduce Contact

BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES OF THE DAY

- As the country ushers into the New Normal era, minimum health standards are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe. The government is continuously reminding the public to follow simple precautions that would reduce exposure to COVID-19 like wearing face masks at all times, maintaining physical distancing, and practicing hand hygiene and proper cough manners. Do this not just for yourselves, but also for the safety of your family and the community.
- In the <u>office/workplace settings</u>, before entering the workplace, employees/workers should see to it that they are screened for symptoms. All should maintain physical distancing or a 1-meter distance from others, always wear face masks, and practice hand hygiene and proper coughing manners. The workplace must be regularly disinfected, especially regularly used objects such as keyboards and doorknobs.
- It is advised that you remove your shoes when you enter your house, wash your hands with soap and water, and immediately change clothes or take a bath when you return home from work.

 Separate dirty clothes, don't shake it to minimize the possibility of dispersing the virus through the air. Wash items with detergent and bleach, using the warmest appropriate water setting and dry items completely both steps help kill the virus.





HOW DO YOU REMAIN SAFE AND HEALTHY AMIDST THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC?

ALWAYS remember and practice the following:



Wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds or more (Try singing the chorus of your favorite song while washing).



Use a hand sanitizer with 70% alcohol if you can't wash your hands for 20 seconds or more.



Avoid touching your face, especially your mouth, eyes, nose.



Make sure you keep 1 meter distance from other people.



Avoid touching things that many people touch like door handles, tables, chairs, etc.



Wear a mask while outside.



Frequently clean surfaces in your house, work or business. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keys, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.



Disinfect using a bleach solution (7 tablespoons [100 mL] bleach for 1 liter of clean water).




Disinfect your most used things (like phone, keys, eyeglasses, keyboard, etc.) with 70% alcohol solution.




BUDGET TRACKER

As of May 15, 2020

- The current DOH-managed cash for COVID-19 health response is 52 billion. Majority or 88 percent comes from the supplemental budget of 45.72 billion.
- Majority of the total managed cash or 23.57 billion (45 percent) is allocated for case management related commodities such as PPEs, masks and medication. This is followed by laboratory related commodities at 17.11 billion (33 percent) and capital outlay at 5.41 billion (10 percent).
- 81 percent of the total managed cash or 42.3 billion is either with on-going procurement or deliveries, while the remaining 9.78 billion is in the stage of finalizing details of implementation.
- The health response budget has produced 28,865,451 commodities and supported the hiring of 2,537 human resources for health.
